Fishing at Parky's Farm 2013

BUFF has had a partnership with Parky's Farm for several years, and it's a significant win for us on numerous fronts. If you like to fish at a location with concentrations of quality warm water fish, it's a win. If you like the camaraderie, of fly fishers with similar interests, it's a win. If you like to introduce kids or adults to the best outdoor sport ever, it's a win. We get access to a special place that has little fishing pressure and contains sizeable largemouth bass and big, broad bluegills. It might be a little intimidating for those who think fly fishing is all about pan fish or 10" trout, but if the prospect of a 6# bass or big bull bluegill doesn't frighten you, leave the three-wt at home and come to Parky's with some heavier gear. I use a six-wt, but if you want to cast big fluffy bass flies, better make it at least a seven.

Our responsibilities on Parky's 100 acre educational "traditional" farm are enjoyable and productive. Among my most fulfilling experiences is the opportunity to introduce my favorite sport to children – especially if the odds for success are favorable. On Fridays in May and October, from 10:00-2:00, our fly fishing is occasionally interrupted by small children eager to catch their first fish. We lay down the fly rods, pick up some telescoping poles, bait up a bare hook and help them dangle it in the water to see what happens. Whatever takes the bait, it's an exciting moment for a youngster and an opportunity to instill some early interest in fishing. Parents are quick to whip out their cameras for a memorable photo shot, and the kids go home with a trophy picture to show friends and siblings.

Another BUFF activity at Parky's is part of Project Healing Waters, where we have the honor of sharing time on the pond with a few who have served and sacrificed for our country. Watch for announcements of dates when we will get together with a great bunch of veterans who truly enjoy the opportunity to be there with us.

If you need help finding the way, my suggestion is to punch "10073 Daly Road, Cincinnati, OH" into your GPS and go. If you do not use a GPS, directions to Parky's may be found on the BUFF website and Parky's website (<http://greatparks.org/parks/parkys-farm.html>). I'm looking forward to seeing you there!

Black flies are not usually regarded as important trout fare, but scientific studies of some rivers have shown that their larvae make up the majority of the trout's diet.

Black fly larvae are around 3/8" inch long and are found in flowing water where they filter tiny bits of detritus, algae, and bacteria through a fan like brush around their mouth. The larvae attach themselves to rocks, woody debris, vegetation, litter and anything solid lying in the stream and often exist in dense mats with their bodies packed tightly together. They produce a sticky silk from their mouth that they dab on a solid object, then with small hooks on their posteriors attach themselves firmly to the object. Should they become detached, they can let out a string of this sticky silk and use it like a lasso to grab anything passing by. After 3-10 weeks of larval development it is time to pupate and the larvae prepare a rigid sack-like cocoon with the open end facing downstream that they back into. Then in two to eight weeks a fully formed adult emerges inside an air bubble that keeps them dry and quickly floats them to the surface where they immediately go airborne. The emergence of adults is somewhat random, and there is no real black fly "spinner fall" but they will often rise up in enormous numbers. Female black flies may swarm and lay their eggs on a relatively small section of a stream. One stretch of water had an estimated 3 million eggs. With that many eggs and four or more generations in a season, it shouldn't be a surprise why black fly larvae comprise a large part of a fish's diet.

Spring Trout Quest Trip

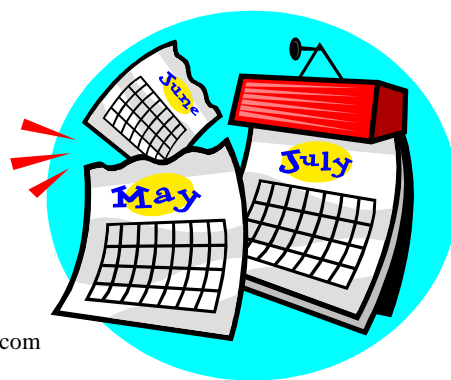

Follow Tylersville Road west to Cox Road. Turn right onto Cox Road and follow Cox Road north to VOA Park Drive. Turn right onto VOA Park Drive. Turn left onto first drive and follow roadway to Lodge.
