Casting for Recovery

Why breast cancer and Fly Fishing? "Casting for Recovery" is a program for survivors of any age and at any stage of breast cancer. Walk with us through a weekend of hope.

Dates have been set for two knot tying classes - January 20th and 22^{nd.} The classes will be held at the Springdale Community Center from 6:30 to 9 PM. Knot-tying experts will be there to help you with knots needed to properly rig-up your reels, lines, leaders and flies. Details will be provided in January.

The BUFF Fly Fishing 101 Course will be held on the first four Monday nights in March. Classes will also be held at the Springdale Community Center. This course is designed to help beginner as well as intermediate-skilled fly fishers. Details will be provided in February.

2007 BUFF Program Service Accomplishments

The IRS requested a listing of our service accomplishments as part of our 2007 income tax filing in May this year. The listing, provided below, provides a nice summary of the club activities. I thought it worthwhile sharing with the membership. Our 2008 service accomplishments listing will be almost the same with some minor changes.

Specifics of the Club's 2007 Activities/Programs are:

- 1. Our club held it's annual "Greater Cincinnati Fly Fishing Show" in Fairfield, Ohio in February, 2007. This event is our major public educational event each year; approximately 600 participants attended.
- 2. Beginners fly casting course: limited to 12 participants; three 4 hour classes.
- 3. Intermediate fly casting course: limited to 12 participants; three 4 hour classes.
- 4. Beginners Fly Fishing 101 Course: 25 participants; four 2 hour classes plus two 3 hour hands-on fly fishing labs at a local pond.
- 5. Beginners fly tying course: 15-20 participants; five 2 hour sessions.
- 6. Advanced fly tying course: 10-15 participants; four 2 hours sessions.
- 7. Three monthly "Tie & Lie" fly tying gatherings: 3-12 participants; a lead tier at each session teaches the participants to tie a specific fly pattern.
- 8. Parky's Farm Kids Fishing Program in conjunction with the Hamilton County Park District: Held from 10 AM to 2 PM each Friday in April, May, September and October; serves primarily pre-schoolers and grammar school students on class outings; varies from 10 to over 200 children per Friday depending on the number of school buses that bring students to Parky's Farm for the day visit: we have helped several hundred kids each year catch their first fish since the program was initiated in 2003.
- 9. VA Hospital Outreach Program: Initiated in 2007 with two tying sessions; helped 8-15 veterans tie fishing flies at the Cincinnati VA Hospital.
- 10. "Casting For Recovery" is a national program designed to help women with or recovering from breast cancer. Fly fishing is part of this program because the fly casting motion is the motion used to strengthen the breast muscles. The Ohio "Casting For Recovery" chapter was initiated by one of our members about three years ago. The program is a three-day weekend retreat serving 14 participants each year; our club provides the organizational leadership and 14 fly fishing helpers for the fishing part of the program.
- 11. East Fork of the Little Miami River Clean-Up sponsored by the Clermont County Soil & Water Department: BUFF supplies cooks and meals for 10 20 river clean-up volunteers.

2008 Reflections Andy Sutthoff

My involvement with BUFF during the past year has been a memorable and fruitful experience. Whether as an educator, student or participant, I have throughly enjoyed being with others, who share my interest in fly fishing. Simply put, BUFF is an outstanding club because of its supportive and active membership. The diversity of club-sponsored trips, pertinent education classes and community outreach underscores the value of our club. As such, I would like to share some experiences from the past year.

On May 31, I traveled to Elkcreek Hunt Club for a Cast and Blast program sponsored by BUFF member, Mike Reed. Assisted by my father, George, we conducted a casting clinic for participants in Mike's outdoor weekend. Our student base consisted of both adults and children, with everybody being absolute beginners – the perfect environment for introducing the basic cast and accompanying principles. After a half an hour of instruction, some students tested their newly procured skills on resident pond fish. This venture proved most enjoyable as one woman hooked, fought and caught her first fish – a feisty and acrobatic smallmouth bass, which succumbed to a gummy minnow. Metaphorically speaking, she was definitely on Cloud Nine. Such enthusiasm and success of one's students make the teaching process very rewarding.

I would be remiss, however, if I did not recognize the hospitality and kindness of Mike Reed. Mike allowed my father and me to participate in the program's sporting clay shoot and also treated us to a delectable dinner among those who participated in the Cast and Blast weekend. I even had the opportunity to exercise a sizeable number of largemouth bass. Mike a true gentleman and the club should be justifiably proud to have members like him among our ranks.

The BUFF Casting Program has taught many club members the fundamentals of casting. I am a product of this effort. Not long ago, as a new club member, I sought to improve my own cast, or perhaps more accurately, to develop a cast. I had no trouble casting a rod, but I quickly discovered such untrained mechanics did not translate into a workable cast nor even a paucity of elegance. So I enrolled in Beginner's Casting and then progressed to the Intermediate course. After much practice and able instruction from Gary Begley, Tom Scheer, and Steve Walker, I passed the BUFF examination for Club Instructor.

I am often reminded of a quote by the French essayist, Joseph Joubert: to teach is to learn twice. This year constituted my first full season as a BUFF Casting Instructor. Being part of a group of dedicated "educators" was a fulfilling experience. This opportunity allowed me to improve my own teaching skills while also forcing me to think critically about the art and science of casting. Of course, the students in our casting classes helped immensely by poising insightful questions and disclosing casting problems, which challenged me to refine my understanding of casting theory and mechanics. With the reorganization of the Casting School to better reflect membership needs, along with improving casting education through upgrades in technology, I am excited for the future of our excellent casting program.

There have been very few experiences in my relatively short life that have impacted me as emotionally as the Casting for Recovery (CFR) retreat at Indian Bear Lodge in Walhonding, Ohio on September 14. Thirteen courageous, inspirational, and fun-loving women attended this year's retreat. Their stay began on Friday night and culminated with graduation on Sunday afternoon. Throughout the weekend our awesome group of women learned the fundamentals of fly tying, knot construction, and casting. This basic education acted as a primer for their weekend fly-fishing adventures. By Sunday, I could tell the women were forming lifelong friendships, bound together by their unique experiences.

- 12. "Women-In-The-Outdoors" programs sponsored by the Wild Turkey Federation: BUFF provided fly casting, fly fishing and fly tying classes for a spring and a fall event; 10 15 women participated in the fly fishing courses.
- 13. "Great Outdoors Weekend" sponsored by the Green Acres Foundation located in Indian Hills, Ohio. BUFF was one of over 40 conservation organizations participating in the weekend event; we provided fly casting and fly tying for participants interested in our sports. Typically we get 15 40 participants at this event.
- 14. Indian Hills High School Outdoor Recreation Class: Buff has been invited to the high school for several years to provide a combination fly tying/fly casting class for this program each semester. 15 25 students typically attend.
- 15. Fly rods building class: this class is limited to 7-8 participants.
- 16. Fish net building class: this class is limited to 7-8 participants.
- 17. Fly fishing knot tying class: 15 members participated in this class.
- 18. Derby City Fly Fishing Club Expo in Louisville, Kentucky: Buff had an educational booth at their show; several hundred visitors attended.
- 19. Cleveland Fly Tying Expo: Buff had a fly tying booth at the Expo; several hundred visitors attended.
- 20. The Cincinnati Chapter of "Fishing Has No Boundaries" (a national organization devoted to holding fishing events for the disadvantaged) holds a fishing weekend event for mentally and physically challenged individuals at Cowan Lake State park; BUFF provides several volunteers for the event to assist with participant fishing needs; 120 challenged persons, several in wheelchairs, participated in the event.
- 21. Boy Scout Events: Several of our members are associated with Boy Scout Troops; these members periodically provide fly fishing/fly tying programs for the scouts.

I had the honor and pleasure of fishing with Melissa. Our personalities were similar. She was soft spoken and sociable, but not overly gregarious. People who know me well would describe me similarly. After a brief exchange of pleasantries, we headed to the pond. Melissa wanted to immerse herself into the water while fishing. I heartily agreed with her proposition. The early morning could not have been nicer: blue skies and sunshine, with a light breeze. The water was moderately cool; it gently lapped against our waders.

Throughout the morning and early afternoon, Melissa and I worked on casting as we presented flies to the pond's resident bluegill and bass. Melissa mentioned she felt refreshed and rejuvenated by just being in the water, a sense of peace with her surroundings. We chatted about our lives, the CFR retreat, and anything else that struck our fancy. As any "River Stud" worth his plaudits, I shared stories and told of past outdoor adventures. Before long, our fishing adventure came to an end. Melissa asked if we could wade back to our entry point, instead of walking on the grass. I saw no safety objection to this request. This was her day, her time. I was merely a participant.

Graduation signaled the day's impending end. The CFR staff, led by coordinator Debbie Hampton, presented each participant with a certificate of completion. There were many warm embraces, many tears shed, and many kind words offered. It was a visceral experience for me: these women are fighters, blessed with a strong spirit and an unrelenting love for life. They have so much to offer. I was honored to share this weekend with them.


