BUFF December 2012 Program

"The extraordinary life of the endangered freshwater mussel: protection, conservation, management, and restoration in America's streams and rivers"

Monte McGregor will explore an overview of the status of the most endangered group of aquatic animals in North America along with the causes for their declines. We will look at methods for restoration, and plans and actions for recovery.

You will see captured underwater video of extraordinary observed behavior, learn of connections of mussels to fish and other aquatic species, understand the plight of the most endangered group of animals in North America, and much more. You will also hear about fascinating research at Kentucky's state of the art mussel research station-the Center for Mollusk Conservation.

Speaker: Monte McGregor

Monte is a native of western Kentucky and a 1989 graduate of Murray State University (B.S. Biology). He obtained a M.S. (aquatic biology) from Tennessee Technological University in 1991. His doctoral work was completed in 2000 at Auburn University in the internationally known "Department of Fisheries and Allied Aquacultures" where he worked on stream macroinvertebrates in pristine streams in Alabama.

He worked for 6 years as a malacologist with the Virginia Department of Game & Inland Fisheries where he started the Aquatic Wildlife Conservation Center. He has been with Kentucky Department of Fish & Wildlife Resources since 2002.

He is especially interested in restoration of aquatic communities, including propagation of mussels under controlled conditions. Mussel culture is a relatively new field, but has promise in that its product will provide the necessary knowledge to repopulate mussels into our rivers and streams.

Monte was recently (2012) awarded the honor of being the "Naturalist of the Year for Kentucky" by the Kentucky Society of Natural History.

Skip Morris Fly Tying Clinics

BUFF is proud to present Fly Tying Clinics with nationally acclaimed fly tyer Skip Morris. The clinics will be held on Friday, February 1, 2013 at Christ's Church in Mason. There will be two clinics: 10am - 12 noon and 2-4 pm.

Reservations are required and will be limited to 25 tiers per session. Cost for the clinics will be \$40 for one and \$60 for both. BUFF members will be given reservations priority until January 9 (regular monthly BUFF meeting) and then reservations will be opened to other area fly fishing clubs. Reservation forms will be available at the December & January BUFF meetings and online at www.buckeflyfishers.com.

This is an opportunity to learn fly tying from a master fly designer and tyer. Skip has over forty years of experience at the vise and on the water. He is the author of 12 books including the top-selling fly tying book in America since 1992, *Fly Tying Made Clear and Simple*, now in its 23rd printing.

Skip's books and tying clinics are in huge demand partly because Skip understands not only fly tying and fly fishing in a way few do—but mainly because **he understands the** *teaching* **of these skills** with rare depth. **This is Skip's passion.** And he really loves sharing what he's discovered with other fly fishers at all levels. His books and tying sessions are carefully thought out, thorough, and easy to follow.

Each of Skip's original fly designs are tested and tested again, altered this way and that, to make the fly as effective and consistent as he can make it. It's a slow evolution—a fly can take three or more years to perfect (but if one just never measures up, Skip will abandon the design altogether). The finished fly designs are tough, they do just what they're supposed to do (land upright, hook fish effectively, swim or shimmy or float), and fish love them.

If you turn over a rock in a stream, particularly in late fall or early winter, you will likely find what appears to be a very large gray maggot. It is a Cranefly larva in the insect order Diptera or "True Fly" which means that they have only one pair of wings. Some True Flies such as mosquitoes, midges and black flies must have a "blood meal" before they can reproduce, but fortunately for us, the Cranefly doesn't. The Cranefly Larvae feed mostly on leaves and woody material referred to as detritus, and our local deciduous trees provide them with ample fodder. After the egg stage Craneflies have a relatively long larval stage, for some specie up to 5 years, before they go through a brief pupal then the adult stage. Their metamorphosis is remarkable as they change from a rather ugly crawly thing to a large and delicate long legged flying insect. North America has around 1500 specie of crane flies, some are aquatic and others are terrestrial. Unless you live close to a stream, the one perched ominously on the wall most likely came from under a log. They won't bite because their sole function as adults is to mate and they barely have enough time for that because their adulthood is often measured in hours.



Procedures for Selection Fly Fisher of the Year

The following procedure/timeline for selection the Fly Fisher of the Year (FFofY) was approved at the October Board of Directors meeting. It will be incorporated into the BUFF official Guidelines & Policies, and will be used for the selection on the 2012 FFofY.

- 1. By November of each calendar year, the President will present to the Board of Directors a recommendation for a Fly Fisher of the Year Nominating Committee composed of 3-5 BUFF members in good standing, including at least one member of the Board of Directors. The Board will accept or amend the recommendation as it deems appropriate. Serving Nominating Committee members will not be eligible for the FFofY award for that year.
- 2. The Nominating Committee will select it's committee chair, determine it's operating procedures, and solicit recommendations from the membership, including rationale for each recommendation, not later than December.
- 3. The Nominating Committee will consider all recommendations and prepare a ballot consisting on not more than 5 nominees from the membership recommendations, and distribute ballots at the January or February membership meetings. <u>Nomination</u> forms will be available this year at both the December and January meetings and on-line. Voting will be at the February meeting. FFofY selection should be based on service to BUFF, organization priorities and activities, and to fly fishing in general, rather than personal friendships.
- 4. The Nominating Committee will tally ballots and inform the President of balloting results no later than the February Board of Directors meeting.
- 5. The President will make the award at the annual banquet.

Fly Fisher of the Year Procedure Correction {See above}

The November Buffer article explaining newly adopted procedures for selecting the Fly Fisher of the Year included an error by indicating that the Nomination Committee would distribute ballots at January and **February** membership meetings. The new policy recently adopted by the Board provides that ballots should be distributed at either the January or February general meeting (not both). Nomination forms will be available this year at both the December and January meetings and online. Voting by paper ballot will be at the February meeting only.


