I JOINED BUFF TO GO FISHING.

I joined BUFF just the week before the salmon trip so I couldn't get the logistics organized in time to go. But when I heard about the Lil' Red trip I moved out to get goin'. I talked with Dick Nabor and planned to ride shotgun with him, share the guide on Monday and take the rest as it came. When Dick called and told me that Tom threw him down the bank during their steelhead mis-adventure (Dick broke his ankle and Tom really didn't throw him down the bank), I thought that my trip was dashed. The rest of the trippers rallied to help. Tom Scheer and Fritz let me ride down with them, Sam West and I agreed to share the guide, and I bunked in with Don Prince. All systems go.

Tom and Fritz are the odd couple. One is a right brain thinker, the other a left brain thinker. The drive flew by as we talked away and made disparaging remarks to the voice in Tom's GPS. At the motel I met the rest of the BUFFers. Sam and I were supposed to meet the guide at 7:30am in the parking lot. When Sam knocked on the motel door at 7:18 (and woke me up) and asked if I was ready, I said yes! I was dressed and outside by 7:25.

Tom and Fritz went with a guide, Sam and I went with a guide, and the rest of the crew went off to Cow Shoals to catch a bigg'un. Our guide tied on a tiny jig-head fly with not much more than black maribou and a little crystal flash. The jig head pattern is made to hang horizontally in the water. Once the depth is set with the indicator, its just a matter of getting used to the subtle take of the trout. "Sam,,,Get'em Get'em Get'em, yelled the guide again. Finally Sam raised his rod and the stink was off! The guide asked, "Sam, one point of Parliamentary procedure, why didn't you strike sooner?" "Well, I wanted to give the trout a fighting chance!", responded Sam. Sam and I both caught a limit of rainbows, but we also wished the "vertical" technique was a little more challenging.

Tuesday, everyone fished right below the dam. There was no new water and the fishing was slow. Doc Scheer was the only one with a limit, he fished one of the drain tubes of the hatchery, and was able to pick off fish after fish. I tried everything in my bag of tricks, including 7X tippet, but got skunked.

Wednesday was different. The power company had generated during the night and the water was way up from the prior days. We (the lot of us) rented jon boats and motored to Mossy Shoals (below the pool where Sam I fished with the guide). The ride took about 30 minutes though dense morning fog. Fishing at Mossy Shoals was good. The main pattern was egg attractor with a redass dropper. Everyone caught fish.

Thursday's plan was to was to tear 'em up at Cow Shoals. It was cold and windy and no one was catching any fish, not any of the 15+ fishermen standing in the 400 yard run. So we did the honorable thing and ran over to the "Swingin Bridge". Bob Mackey fished the same 20 feet of water right at the bridge piling for 6 hours straight, and caught a few big browns. I fished just up from him at the tailout of the big pool. I had the MoJo this day and couldn't keep them off, (all rainbows up to 14 inches). I did most of my work with a purple beadhead sowbug and the irresistable redass.

Friday was time for us (me, Doc Scheer and Fritz) to head on back home. I had a great time on my inaugural fishing trip and plan on making it a practice.

A Tale of Two Guides

(On the Little Red River) By Sam West

It was the best of times, it was the worst of times as I sat in the long, narrow, Arkansas jon boat on a blustery, overcast morning. Rain threatened, but always retreated after trying to bluff us off the river. Drifting from one flat section of the river to the other with our guide, Bob, and my partner, Ted, we were having a comfortable morning of float fishing. Using a Red Ass soft hackle fly hanging about two feet below a stick-on strike indicator did not seem to be attracting any fish that morning. Bob switched the Red Ass over to a 1/16 ounce jig head with about an inch of brown marabou waving behind. The fish became interested, well uh, in Ted's offering anyway, as he pulled in feisty rainbows on a continuous basis. Either I was still interested in napping for a while longer, or the fish were just attracted to the back of the boat and Ted's identical bait. We will never know for sure, as I spent a couple of morning hours with marginal results. Ted and Bob seemed to be having a party at the back of the boat as they became good friends landing and taking the fish tenderly off the hook every 5 minutes or so. I often think at those times that I was meant to lead a solitary life.

Lunch time was nearing and that is always a good time for me. Things always get better after a good shore lunch. Bob eased the boat into the bank and provided some sandwiches and soft drinks that we greatly enjoyed. Ted became interested in the large splashing sound just a bit downstream where the pool quickened its pace as it raced into the shallow, riffling shoal below. This shoal we found out was called Mossy Shoal. We could see some fellows wading in the shallows in the distance. Ted finally found the cause of the splashing. A very nice 20" plus brown was in the throes of it's spawning dance. Ted got a glint in his eye, and a slight drool at the corner of his mouth, he was definitely hooked. This shoal would require some additional exploration, but later, we had no waders with us this day.

The afternoon was better for me, my eyes finally opened to see the indicator begin sinking from time to time. And if I waited long enough, I would be rewarded with a nice rainbow who merrily danced in the water for me. Setting the hook too soon just brought the fly rig back to me. Bob became frustrated at my patient hook set. I forgave him for his impatience, but it was the hook set that worked for me.

A couple of days later, the entire BUFF group decided to rent some boats and check out Mossy Shoals first hand. Landing at the previous day's lunch site, we descended upon the shoals, spreading out to explore every inch. Yes, you guessed it; Ted went straight to the remembered splash spot on a quest for the big brown that had teased him. Upon our arrival, another Arkansas jon boat, the guide owner, and his two patrons slipped down into the shoal to the area we were heading for. These boats are perfect for this water, stable in the pools, narrow enough to slip between stream boulders, and shallow draft enough to slip into inches of water. His outboard motor used a big centrifugal water pump, (usually called a jet), rather than a propeller, to allow extremely shallow water motive force.

The guide and patrons disembarked from the boat and were soon casting into a seam where two currents met. They quickly had fish on, which the guide quickly removed and got them back fishing. He then went over and leaned against his boat where I caught up with him. After some quick polite chit-chat, we got down to business. "What kinda' bait ya' usin" came the eventual question. The guide offered some quick and polite advice, "Red Ass dropper about 12" below an egg, then a tiny bit of pinch-on weight or very small split shot another 12" up, then a strike indicator about 12" above that. Seemed easy enough to remember, the "rule of the foots" I called it. As the guide headed over to take another fish off one of his patrons hook, I meandered on downstream to seek my fortune for the day.

Quickly, if you can call it quick, I rearranged the single hook Hares Ear Nymph and indicator I had on, to the guides "foots" recipe. This went well and I started picking up a fish or two, in between straightening out the tangles I was getting in my tippet. Always a frustration, these tangles are. When others were not looking, I think a tear came to my eye and maybe a sniffle or two, as I untangled or re-lined the tippet area of my rig yet again. Going back to the water from yet another untangling, I was false casting to get to the right spot. The line was unfolding on the presentation cast when a rainbow jumped out of the water at my fly. And he was on, er, something was on, he was not that big, but fought like a tarpon. "Oh heck – he must have gotten foul hooked." Finally bringing him to hand, I found that he had been tangled in the line and was lassoed around his mid section, no hook had penetrated. Now is that a good fish story or what? The "one that did not get away" due to my talented lassoing skills! The guide and his patrons got back into the boat and went on down to the tail of the shoals and resumed fishing down there. I turned and decided it was time for lunch, always a good time for that "Ya' know?"

Arriving back at the boat, others had gathered for the same reason. I started talking about my horrible morning of tangles. Most nodded solemnly in agreement, "stuff happens, ya' know," someone exclaimed. Bruce joined in the conversation "ya' know, that guide was telling me that when you are using a double fly rig, ya' can't do any false casts. One cast is all you can get by with before the tangles set in. And ya' can't have any bead head flies on the rig, they'll create tangles too." "Hmmmm" we all nodded in judicial agreement." In later studies at home, I also found that you have to open your casting loop when using a two fly rig. Either way, the afternoon was much more enjoyable without the many tangles. And when you are not sitting on the bank, sniffling, and untangling your line, you can catch more fish, as was the afternoon's reward.

Getting on toward dusk the guide boat came back up through the shoals, passing us, heading upstream toward home. As the boat rounded the river bend and out of sight, someone asked "who was that guide?" I answered, "I didn't ask, I just wanted to know what kinda' bait he was using."

2008 BUFF Banquet Blind & Silent Auctions (Banquet Saturday March 8, 2008)

2008 BUFF Banquet Blind Auctions Rules

The Blind auctions work like this. Place your name (name labels provided in packet when you arrive) and write your bid (minimum bid amount required) on a bid slip provided; then place bid slip in the container provided at the Banquet. The highest bidder wins and will be announced later in the evening along with the General and Grand Raffles.

2008 BUFF Banquet Silent Auctions Rules

The Silent auctions work like this. Write your name, bidder number (assigned in your packet) and bid (minimum bid required for item) on Silent Auction Bid Form. Other persons may bid on the same item (minimum raise amount as noted) on the item Silent Auction Bid Form. There will be hidden timers, set for different times, for the various Silent Auction Bid items. When the timer goes off that item, the bidding is closed and the last bid posted will win. Winners will be announced later in the evening along with the General and Grand Raffles.

Banquet Blind & Silent Auction Items


