### **MEMBERSHIP DUES**

#### The following information is taken from the BUFF Policies

- There is <u>no</u> change in current dues amounts (single, \$25/yr.; family, \$30/yr.).
- The anniversary date for each membership shall be January 1<sup>st</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup> each year.
- Members must be in good standing (listed on the membership roster) to be eligible for club classes and trips and to receive the BUFFER.
- All "new" members will pay a "one-time" initiation fee of \$5 included with their membership dues.
- Dues for new members joining during the year will be pro-rated to put their anniversary date on the January 1st December 31<sup>st</sup> schedule
- Beginning in 2008, membership dues will be due on January 1<sup>st</sup> each year.
- Starting in 2008, renewing members will have a grace period from January 1<sup>st</sup> until the March general meeting to pay their yearly dues. After that date they will be dropped off the membership roster and be treated as a new member upon rejoining the club.
- Members who have already paid their full dues in 2007 prior to the months under the 2007 prorated procedures, will owe a reduced membership fee on January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2008 to renew to December 31, 2008. The amount owed will be the pro-rated amount. (See the Treasurer to determine the exact amount)

## What happened to the zebras? Steve Lilly

On March 27, 2007, the Army Corps of Engineers reduced the outflow for the Ceasar Creek Dam from 1225cfs to 238cfs. This caused the creek below the dam to drop from a gage height of 9.2 ft to 6.4ft, almost 3 feet. As the creek receded from the bank, several million zebra mussels became stranded. These zebra mussels were so thick, they were virtually shoulder to shoulder all along the edge of the creek, and in some spots were bunched up three or four deep. All of them were alive because Zebra mussels can live for weeks out of the water. Although they attach themselves to whatever solid objects are available, such as intake pipes, these zebra's were not attached to anything. They don't have any appendage like a foot for locomotion as many mussels do, but sometimes they will bunch up in a ball and let the current roll them along. Many such balls of zebras could be found along the creek bank. All of these stranded zebras were waiting for the water to rise so that they could get on with things. In addition to the stranded zebras, many more were still in the stream, and were firmly attached to the stream substrate by way of their byssal threads.

All summer long, anyone wading in the creek could easily find lots of zebra mussels attached to the rocks all along the creek bottom. If a rock were lifted from the stream, many zebras of all sizes could be found on the rock's underside.

However, by November there wasn't a zebra to be found anywhere in Ceasar Creek. They are not on or under any rocks. Maybe one or two could be found in a backwater, some distance from the main stream, but otherwise they were all gone. What happened to all those millions of zebras that were so prevalent in the early spring?



#### **Directions:**

From I-275 – Take Exit 46, (US 42), south for three miles to Glendale-Milford Rd. --Continue south and RAFFEL'S will be on the left approximately 3/10 mile.

From I-75 -- Take Exit 14, east, on Glendale-Milford Rd. until the intersection of US 42, (Reading Rd). Turn right (south) on US 42, and RAFFEL'S will be on the left approximately 3/10 mile.

From I-71 -- Take Exit 15, west, Pfeiffer Rd. & this becomes Glendale-Milford Rd.. At the intersection of US 42, (Reading Rd), turn left, (south) on US 42, and RAFFEL'S will be on the left approximately 3/10 mile.
