BUFF Picnic/Swap Meet July 17 at Central Turners Lake

This year the board has decided to combine the Club picnic and the Swap meet. The picnic will be held on July 17, at The Cincinnati Central Turners Club. There is 3.5 acre lake with club house and picnic area. This facility is also the home of the Cincinnati Casting Club with casting targets to test your skills and the lake is stocked with bluegill and bass (catch and release). The picnic starts at 1:00 PM and will run till dark. A picnic meal will be served between 4:30 and 5:00 PM. Cost will be \$10 for adults and \$5 for children under 12.

The park is located on 2200 Pinney Lane, Cincinnati, Ohio 45231.

Direction: I-275 (Cincinnati North side of loop) Exit Mt. Healthy – Fairfield. South on Hamilton Avenue, approx. 2 miles; right on Pinney Lane. Pinney Lane runs dead into the park.

Adopt-a-Stream (Lessons in Patience) Donn Rubingh

It seemed so easy. Get a group of people together arrange some transportation and canoes and float down a stretch of the Little Miami River picking up trash and catching fish. We would do it three times a year. My trip would be in the Spring.

We set the first one up for Saturday May 15. I arranged with Nate Holscher of River Unlimited to get some onion bags, shovels, gloves for the trash pick up and with Mark Bersani of Loveland Canoe rental for people transportation, and Annie Kivett from the Izaak Walton League for canoe transportation. We had about 14 people and we set to go-until the rains came. On Wednesday night the Little Miami was running at better than 1000 cubic feet/ second at Milford. After consulting with Mark, Bill Schroeder and a few other experts on the Little Miami we decided to cancel. I was bummed a bit, as maybe were some of our volunteers, but this is Spring and this happens.

It was the backup trip that really got to me. The first time I could do it was June 5. I sent out a note to all interested people and got a few responses. After a second note and a glowing report of the river conditions I managed to get a crew of about 12 (thanks to all of you). I also got some "grabbers" from Nate so we wouldn't have to always jump out of the canoes for trash. We were ready! Then the thunderstorms came on Wednesday, and Thursday and the river flow jumped from 463 to 781 cubic feet/sec. Friday morning I drove to Isabella Park and took a look-even did a bit of fishing. It was a bit high, but I could see about a foot in the water and it didn't look that treacherous for canoeing so I sent a note to participant that it was a go and left messages with Mark and Annie we were planning to go ahead.

The river continued rise-it was over 800 by mid-afternoon-and about 4 p.m. Mark called saying he would not recommend going because the banks would be muddy and treacherous. What to do? Reluctantly I agreed to call the event, which of course meant calling everyone else. Jerry Schatzman, who has fished quite a bit on the Little Miami, was my first call and helped me think through whether this was a good decision. What really got to me this time though was the uncertainty. Did I make the right call? It's enough to drive a man to dr... fishing.

For this year at least the Spring trip won't happen. We'll pick up in July when river conditions are more stable. Thanks to everyone who volunteered to help and also to Mark Bersani and Annie Kivett. They seem willing to help in the future despite our stuttering start. Meanwhile I have a few ideas for backup for next Spring's trip which I will bounce off of you at a later time.

Picnic Fare

An April day on the Watauga Tom Scheer

Mike Adams made the trek to Louisville from East Tennessee for their fly show after an absence of occasional income producing winter trips. In these trying economic times he could only justify one trip from East Tennessee to promote his guide services during a slow winter, unusual since normally conditions in this area lure one or more fly fishers to brave less than 70 degree conditions to leave the confines of their home for a freedom float. Water temperatures in the Watuaga and South Holsten allow insects to proliferate even in winter.

He was enticed to donate a trip by our BUFF fund raiser who also went to Louisville.

Fritz Backscheider and I bid on and won it (under suspicious circumstances. Sorry Jerry). I called and spoke with the very friendly Mike Adams to schedule this trip in late March.

As the date approached the weather forecasters had the gall to suggest that the day we wished to fish would provide a high temperature of 46 degrees, constant precipitation, and wind. Mike totally understood when I asked him to consider my 80 year old fishing partner finds conditions such as this a bit compromising (good excuse for me!). Mike insisted we reschedule (guides hate it when their clients freeze).

Our trip was rescheduled for April 11, 2010. Driving that distance for one day of fishing seems a bit of a waste of fuel and opportunity, so we asked Mike if he had a day on either side, and he did. We floated the Watauga on the 10th, an example day of Spring that we dream about for so many winter months. Cloudless sky, morning jacket, perfect temperature as the day progressed, red buds blooming prolifically. And trout willing to eat a dead drifted nymph, a deep (250 gr 30 ft sink tip) presented heavily weighted size 10 streamer stripped over drop offs, and a dry dropper with the dropper dead drifted just above the bottom. Half way through the day when the fish's interest waned, we pulled over for a marinated grilled steak, a baked potato, and salad followed by a delicious cream pie served on a table cloth covered table under the blush of trees sprouting their leaves. Mike can cook! While he prepared, I reclined on a grass hillock, closed my eyes and enjoyed my daily nap.

We found more interest from the fish as the day progressed, with Mike wishing aloud that around the next corner the conditions would coalesce and the famed Wautaga caddis hatches would begin. As it turns out, all the next corners were barren of caddis, but the catching was consistent enough to keep our interest all day.

The next day, again bright sun, the spectacular terrain awash with awakening trees and flowering woodland floor that framed the Watauga, a tailwater teeming with aquatic life, and rich in its voice, as it progresses from pool, to tail out, to riffle. The sensory input of the river and its surroundings coupled with a cloudless 70 degree day promoted occasionally forgoing pursuit of fish and simply absorbing the wonder of the moment.

Fritz and I found increasing success with our offerings, as we were able to digest and follow Mikes' very excellent direction. Neither Fritz nor I "get" nymphing. Mike helped a great deal with his direction. His guidance in helping us attain better drifts through the art of mending, with the ideal being drag free, was patient and supportive. "Minding" ones line on the water through proper and well timed mending takes some time and repeated efforts to attain. Mikes examples appeared effortless, but when we tried it, it didn't look the same. The trout much preferred Mike's offerings, but we closed the gap some, and the trout responded.

If you get a chance, give Mike a call and visit the East Tennessee tailwaters. Mike is one of BUFF's supporting sponsors.


