The Water Strider

The Water Strider has the ability to walk on water and is sometimes called the Jesus bug.



They can travel on water without breaking the surface tension by virtue of a pad of hair on their feet that traps air and repels water. They have three pairs of legs, two long ones that allow them to be very agile as they

jump or skate to evade a predator or to lurch on a prey, and one pair of short legs to grab and hold the prey. They are very aggressive carnivores and their front legs are highly sensitive to vibration in the water that helps them to locate a prey, mosquito larva being their favorite. The Water Strider does not spend all their time on the water, they can fly away to hibernate through the winter and then re-emerge in the spring. Like all terrestrial insects they breathe air, but they can remain underwater and breathe from a thin layer of trapped air in the velvety hair on their body. The male and female tangle their antennae together and then do a long and vigorous dance on the water before copulating. The female deposits her eggs on vegetation near the water so the larvae will land in the stream after hatching and eventually join the adults on the surface. Water striders go through five stages of development before becoming a mature adult. In the meantime, some juveniles who haven't learned how to glide over the water will "hop" over the surface instead.

New Action at Parky's Farm

For the past several years, Fridays in May and October have found a bevy of Buffers enjoying fishing at a Parky's Farm pond while helping preschoolers net their first bass or bluegill. We have been invited to extend the partnership with a new program. "Friday Fishing Fever" targets adults and families who want to learn fishing and is held every Friday in June and July, 9–10 AM. Parky's must like what we've done in the past and believes we can help. Or maybe our presence around the pond just provides the proper ambiance. Whatever, they will help with instruction and supply the equipment and bait for their participants. We can come early, help as needed for an hour or so, and stay late. There is no need to sign up in advance. Just wake up Friday morning and come on out.

One important item has changed. In the past, we have parked in the Parky's Farm lot with no concern for being ticketed. Parky's is now requiring one-day free volunteer parking permits, unless you have an annual Hamilton County Parks permit (\$10). I can only surmise that the parks system plans to be more aggressive about policing the parking lot. If you need a free one-day permit, please let me know, and I'll email you a dated printable permit (jonesee@mamiOH.edu).

Most of us were disappointed to find the pond at Parky's choked with algae and weeds the first half of May. The pond has since been treated and has been in much better shape the month. And, by the way, we have yet to declare a winner for the biggest bass over 20" for 2013, so come on out and try to win that fabulous prize! 
