The single most venerable quality of fly fishing that appeals to the feminine gender is its unequivocal level of sophistication and decorum. Fishing The Green River

The drive down Route 191 was uneventful and the terrain powerful but stark. So far, my wife was not impressed with the Nebraska, southern Wyoming and now this parched countryside in northern Utah. When the lake finally came into view the blue water was a welcome sight. This was to be the first noteworthy stop in our four week trip through the western states. We planned to fish the "A" waters of the Green River through the Flaming Gorge area.

The next day we met our guide and proceeded to the drop point about a quarter mile below the dam, and we were in business. The river and surrounding cliffs were beautiful. Add to that the joy of landing a dozen trout and it was perfect. The Green is gin clear and the description "aquarium", as Jeff Edwards described it back in Cincinnati was right on. The fish were everywhere. Deep or shallow, they were in every glance you took from the boat. We had a great time and not only were the fish plentiful, but gorgeous and strong. I will confess that although I did catch more fish than Eileen, she caught the biggest. All were in the 14-17" range. The fish were Browns, Rainbows and Cutbows. We used mostly # 18 - 22 nymphs and midges. If you have any questions you can call me. Jeff can give you the skinny on the nymphs, as the ones he gave me prior to the

trip covered most all of the ones the guide provided. One thing that was really brought home was that the drift was critical on this section of the river. The fish see so much action that it is difficult to seduce them. We also seemed to do a lot better than the other boats that were using dries on that day.

There is a path along the "A" section for the entire length and the next day I walked up from the pickup point back over two miles. I saw plenty of fish but was skunked. The only guy I talked to who had any luck that morning from the bank or wading was using a spinning rod with a casting bubble that could reach the channel. He was also using nymphs.

There are few places to stay in Dutch John, Utah. We stayed at the Flaming Gorge Lodge. The cabins were not air conditioned. but they have a variety of cabin and suite sizes to take care of any group. Also of note, the food was absolutely great. They have a schooled chef that will get your attention in the first bite. We contracted for the guide there too. But we actually had a guide (Shane White) from Green River Guide Service. If you decide to fish there I'd recommend you call Dennis Breer at 1-800-835-4551 or e-mail dbreer@union-tel.com. You can visit his web site at www.fishgreenriver.com. Dennis also runs Trout Creek Flies fly shop and has written the Abalone edition about the Green. To look

Net Building Class 2002!

My son, Chris, and I had been looking forward to this net building class for sometime and did not walk away disappointed. Quite the contrary, Paul Feldman, graciously opened his home workshop to us, prepared the materials for us, and expertly led us through the various steps in building our own nets.

He quickly peaked our interest, and hopes, as he showed us some of the nets he has built in the past. We started by picking out the basic shape of the net we wanted to build from the forms he had available. We quickly learned the basics of bending strips of ash and walnut, using steaming hot water to soften the wood, and attaching them to a form to obtain the required shape.

Everyone also learned to cut and shape a piece of walnut that would be used as the handle. At home, we discovered the "fun" of gluing the strips of ash and walnut to the handle without getting epoxy on everything else. Once glued together we all brought our frames back to Paul's to begin the second phase.

The second phase included rough sanding the frame. Once rough

sanded, Paul showed us how to rout a grove around the bow of the net and drill holes to attach the net. Next, Paul discussed finishing the frame and attaching the net. That accomplished, Paul sent us all home to finish the project on our own with the sage advice to complete the net as soon as possible, and not be one of those who never finished his net. I am happy to say Chris and I have finished ours and look forward to using them on many trips with the club – if we decide to risk getting them wet.
