BUFF March 2013 Program

The speaker at the March meeting is Fred Shaw "NEEAKE" who lives in Oxford, Ohio. He is a multifaceted professional and a member of the Shawnee Tribe. He will impart a cultural and conservational view of the environment and fishing history. Come and be transported back in time to learn of a vibrant culture still among us. Your next fishing trip will most likely be viewed in a different perspective.

"Beaver were once so common in the Mill Creek that a 1755 map of the Mill Creek Valley only showed beaver ponds -- the creek was not mapped."

Stanley Hedeen, author of the book "The Mill Creek: An Unnatural History of an Urban Stream"

In 1748 a trading post was established near Piqua to trade with the Indians for beaver pelts. By 1830 there were no beavers left in Ohio. Then in May 1936, in Ashtabula County, a number of Aspen trees on the Ohio side of Pymatuning Reservoir were found with the bark peeled away from their base. Later in 1946 a beaver dam caused a flood in Columbiana County and a study revealed approximately 100 beaver in eleven Ohio counties. By the early 1970s, the population had increased to over 5,000 beaver in thirty-seven counties. Just a few years later, an estimated 7,500 beaver could be found in forty Ohio counties, mostly in eastern and southeastern areas of the state. A survey in 1997-98 reported the Ohio population to be about 25,000. The beaver are back and are once again busy building their dams everywhere they can along the Mill Creek like they did 260 years ago.

Despite snowy conditions, turnout for the 2013 Greater Cincinnati Fly Fishing Show met our high expectations. Nearly 600 persons braved the weather to see 70 exhibitors (many of them new show vendors), day long presentations by fly fishing experts, purchase raffle tickets, and to shop for bargains. The show exceeded recent show attendance results, despite the weather, and the show made a financial profit for BUFF.

The BUFF membership desk also did well during the show, signing up 22 new members.

Visitors enjoyed the Kid's activities (Kid's Area and Kid's Fly Tying) and the new Boy Scout Fly Fishing Merit Badge workroom. Presentations by Skip & Carol Ann Morris, Dane Law, Kevin Howell, Steve Kuieck, Dave Leonhard, Kevin Morlock, Glenn Weisner, and Mike Schmidt were well received by show visitors.







A new show feature that literally made a splash was the indoor casting pond. The casting pond allowed show visitors to try their hand at fly casting and to test cast rods for sale at the show. During the day, there were special casting demonstrations by Dave Leonhard and Kevin Howell, as well as by the very competent BUFF casting instructors.

Many positive comments were received from show visitors and exhibitors about the new show venue, The Oasis. The facility allowed for many additional features and many additional exhibitor booths. Beyond the expansion in useable space, the hall enhanced overall show aesthetics: openness, bright lighting, windows, big rooms for presentations, plenty of room to move about, and designated spaces to rest and eat.

The Fly Show Committee thanks our show visitors, exhibitors, and the many BUFF volunteers who made the show a success! We are already at work planning for next year!


