Fly Fishing Lessons – Tuesdays July 19th or August 2nd


Fly Fishing Lessons will be held on two Tuesdays - July 19th and August 2nd from 9 am – 4 pm at Greenacres River Lab, 209 Railroad Avenue, Loveland, OH. Youth ages 10-12 are invited to participate in these hands-on sessions taught by members of the Buckeye United Fly Fishers Club. Participants will learn about fish including what they eat and how 'fly' fishing lures are made to mimic a fish's preferred foods. They will also learn the 'rules of the road' – how to enjoy fly fishing while respecting the environment and other fishers. Each participant will learn how to: tie common knots used in fly fishing, tie a 'fly' fishing lure, and cast using a fly rod. Participants will then get a chance to practice their skills in the Little Miami River and/or O'Bannon Creek. Participants need to bring a lunch, a hat, sun screen, close-toed sturdy shoes to wade in the river, and a change of clothes. Fly rods and other materials will be furnished for participants use during the class. The class costs \$10.00 per person. Reservations are required. Choose one of the two dates above. Sometimes the best we can do to for nature is to do nothing.

During May as the water temperature rises above 60 degrees, the smallmouth bass prepare for the spawn. The male will go to the same nesting site year after year, generation after generation and will build several "practice nests" until he gets it the way he likes it, usually 2 to 4 feet across and circular. He may then spawn with several females who immediately leave, and he is left with 2,500 to 15,000 eggs to watch over. In 2 to 10 days the eggs start to hatch and now he is busy guarding the fry. He continues to provide protection while the fry travel in schools until eventually they leave on their own. Often as a parting gesture, the guardian male will gobble down a few. The male smallmouth is extremely aggressive during this time and will attack anything including artificial lures that appear as a threat. Should one be hooked and pulled of the nest, the rock bass and blue gill will quickly raid it and forage on the young, then when the male returns he may give up and abandon his nest. This hurts the overall spawning success with fewer smallmouth to grow into adults.

After landing a few nice smallmouth in one place around this time of year, a good angler will realize that he has come upon a spawning site and will leave it alone.



Adopt-a-Stream 2011

Some of you are probably wondering if the adopt-a-stream program is still going on. The short answer is yes it is-with a few changes. The biggest change is that John Cartwright who is an experienced white water kayaker and kayak fisherman has agreed to organize and lead the first two trips this year. Our first trip is scheduled for Saturday May 21 and will run from Fosters to Ikes as before. We can use help on this trip (and probably our subsequent ones) so let John know if you are interested. The second trip is planned for July 10 and involves a joint effort spearheaded by Rivers Unlimited and comprising a variety of canoe liveries and conservation groups all along the Little Miami to clean the whole stream from Yellow Springs to the Ohio River. Our part will be the stretch from Morrow to Roger's Ball Park in South Lebanon (about 5 miles). Finally we have a trip planned for September-the tentative date is September 14-which involves a different stretch of the Little Miami River. The new stretch will be from Lake Isabella to Milford. We chose this stretch since it has no one currently taking care of it-in contrast to the Foster to Ikes stretch-and reportedly the fishing is better here. We plan to make a permanent change to this stretch and have informed our Rivers Unlimited partners of this.



Directions:

From I-275 – Take Exit 46, (US 42), south for three miles to Glendale-Milford Rd. -- Continue south and RAFFEL'S will be on the left approximately 3/10 mile.

From I-75 -- Take Exit 14, east, on Glendale-Milford Rd. until the intersection of US 42, (Reading Rd). Turn right (south) on US 42, and RAFFEL'S will be on the left approximately 3/10 mile.

From I-71 -- Take Exit 15, west, Pfeiffer Rd. & this becomes Glendale-Milford Rd.. At the intersection of US 42, (Reading Rd), turn left, (south) on US 42, and RAFFEL'S will be on the left approximately 3/10 mile.
