# The President's Notes Jeff McElravy

Some of you besides the Board may have noticed, I have been out of town fishing. This trip is a personal one with some other BUFF members and spouses for a part to North Carolina. I have been doing this trip for the last few years and it is always an adventure. I won't be naming any of the streams, creeks, or rivers involved here due to this being published on the website, but will happily tell you, if asked.

Randy Clark and I packed the truck just before our April General Meeting. I realized that the truck was full and I didn't have my fishing stuff in yet. Bummer. I came back home and had to take out some things and repack. It was a tight fit. You wouldn't think that it would take a stuffed full pickup truck to hold gear for a ten day fishing and camping trip. Randy met me at 7:00AM, and we were off to North Carolina. We stopped at Georgetown, KY's, Crackle Barrel, with Charlie Montgomery and his wife Jennette, George Fraley, and Phil Pursley. After a good breakfast, we headed south.

We arrived later that day and met up with Steve Bailey, his wife Sharon, Mike Schubert, and his wife Marietta. Sharon, Steve, and Mike were on the river, and we left to find them. As it always happens, we passed them going the other way on our way to the river. We spread out and found our spots. The fishing was the best it has been for years. I think NC has started stocking more this year than the last couple. It should look good for the upcoming BUFF trip. We all did well. I caught three on a tan EHC, and 13 on the dropper Tellico nymph. This combination became the "go to" rigging for this part of the trip. The next day, Mike, Steve, Randy, and I decided to try another river that was home of one of our recent meeting speakers. It took us a while to find the fish, but when we did, often two of us had fish on at the same time. Three of us had 20 plus fish days. They sure liked the steamers. We took Brooks, Rainbows and Browns. Phil, George, and Charlie stayed closer to home base and did well. We all went back to the home base river for the last day. It treated us as well as before. It was fun gathering for lunch and swapping stories (maybe with just a little exaggeration).

Steve and Mike headed north, and Charlie headed south the next day. Randy, George, Phil, and I left for our camping trip. We found our favorite campsite and the one next was open. It was the maiden trip for my fly and tent. We finally got everything setup and headed to the river which was just over the bank. This river has great fishing in the camping area and better fishing if you are willing to do some hiking. The next two days we caught a lot of fish. You need to ask George, Randy, and Phil about the big ones they landed.

I caught quite a few, but the largest was only about 16" or 17". A storm came in that night and dropped three inches of rain and the winds were strong, too. All the tents and fly held up, with just a little water getting in. Randy and I changed rivers for a trip which I recently won at an auction at one of our meetings. The water was up, so we canceled the guided trip to reschedule later this fall. The shop suggested trying large dark streamers and trying it anyway. Randy caught a good fish, and I got skunked. I even managed to break a guide on my rod. I think a streamer must have hit it on a forward cast. I'm going to have to send it to Mike McFarland to fix. We went back to home base, I managed to recover. We decided to stay instead of moving on as we had planned. We thought this river would clear faster than our other possible stops and would be better fishing. The river did clear and the fishing was good. We stayed two more days and wore the fish out (or is it, they wore us out). There are some good stories here, but ask us in person.

The last day we broke down camp and headed for home. We did have a little side trip to the Lodge Outlet and Coleman Outlet in Sevierville, TN. I have a hard time going by there without stopping. I didn't leave too much cash there!

This trip grew out of BUFF trips that we have taken over the years. Our trips are the best way to learn how to fish and a great place to develop new friendships. They are the reasons most of us join BUFF in the first place. Make room in your schedules and join us as often as you can. It will be well worth it.

She has been a teacher, naturalist, and environmental enforcement officer. Kentucky born, she lived in Alaska for nearly 10 years, where both of her children were born. She currently lives in Finneytown, Ohio. Her degree is in Biological Science from Northern Kentucky University. Her passion is to get people comfortable in the outdoors so that they enjoy the beauty of the natural world.

### "I think that I shall never see a poem lovely as a tree." Trees Joyce Kilmer 1886-1918

To honor the poet, a small part of the Appalachian old growth forest was set aside where the Hemlock Trees were centuries old, over a hundred feet tall, and several feet around. Now they are all dying. Within the next few decades, there will no longer be any Hemlock Trees anywhere in the Appalachians as they go the way of the Chestnut Tree. The culprit is an infestation of a tiny insect from Asia, the Hemlock Wooly Adelgid. The Adelgid was first noticed in the Eastern US in the 1950's and has spread at a rapid rate particularly in the southern Appalachian region where the climate is milder. It feeds on the sap of tender hemlock shoots and injects a toxin causing the tree to lose its needles then death occurs in four to ten years. The Hemlock typically grows in moist areas, particularly the stream riparian. As they die off the streams will become less shaded, the water will be warmer with less oxygen, a faster runoff with carry more sediment, and a surge of tannic acid will leach into the watershed. The Carolina Hemlocks have a deep tap root that allows shrubs and other shade loving plants with shallow roots, particularly the Rhododendron, to thrive under their canopy. Their replacement will likely be Maple and Birch trees with shallow roots, but, like Kilmer's poetry, the Appalachian forest will live on.

Traveling east on Ronald Reagan Cross County Highway take the Winton Road exit (traveling west, take the Galbraith Rd. exit and turn right onto Winton Rd.). Follow Winton Rd. north for approximately 3 miles. Turn left onto Southshore Drive, which dead-ends at the Parky's Farm entrance.




