Hope all of you had a great summer and some decent fishing to boot. Farm pond fishing for bluegills and bass has been slow for me especially with all the extra hot days keeping me sitting by the air conditioner. Hopefully, the weather will cool down and provide some good October fishing in the local ponds and streams. I did manage to catch my first northern pike on my fly rod while on vacation in Minnesota last month. It wasn't large, about 24 inches. It took one of my special, tan-colored streamers.

For those of you planning some fall steelhead fishing in northern Ohio remember BUFF has a membership at the Pine Lake Trout Club in the Cleveland area. Pine Lake offers cabin facilities and back-up trout fishing should the weather turn bad and blow-out the streams while you are up there. The Pine Lake rules and regulations are posted on the club website for your use.

The beginner's fly tying classes will be held on Friday nights in October at the Springdale Recreation Center. Contact Ken West for details (513-726-6253) or just show-up ready to go. No previous tying experience is necessary and club tying tools are available if you need them. Taking these classes or attending a few "Tie and Lie" sessions are great ways to get started in this fun area of our sport. Catching your first fish on a fly you tied yourself is a rewarding experience; on-the-other-hand, losing your "perfect" fishing-catching creation on the first cast after spending an hour or so tying it is a different kind of experience some of us have had the opportunity to enjoy (ha!).

Upcoming club fishing opportunities this fall include the Smoky Mountain Trout Trip (contact Don Prince; 513-398-0921), the Parky's Farm Kids Fishing program at Winton Woods on Fridays (contact Roger Corrado; 741-8411), and the Arkansas Little Red River Trout Trip. Details will be provided later.

State Wildlife Officer Josh Zientek assigned to Hamilton County will be giving a presentation at the October meeting. He will be proving a slide presentation on the job duties of a State Wildlife Officer with ODNR Division of Wildlife and discussing the importance of the 1-800-POACHER hot line which deals with Turning In Poachers. He will also be able to answer any questions that people may have dealing with wildlife law enforcement. A Wildlife Officer may be better known to many as the game warden.

Saltery Lake – Kodiak Alaska David W. Traut

I was still feeling the effects of jet lag when I wrote this, so it may sound a little jumbled.

This was the trip that I picked up through the silent auction this year and trust me, it was a blast. Bottom line on the fishing, spectacular. While the counts are just estimates, for the week "I" landed:

- > 1 Silver Salmon (the main run won't begin until mid to late September)
- ➢ 5 Sockeye Salmon (teased one fish so much he finally hit the polar shrimp that I was throwing in desperation)
- ➢ 40 Chum Salmon (the last day there I began to fish to specific fish. Had just made my cast and was stripping it in when a seal came in and nailed him.)
- 100 Pink Salmon (this number is probably low. We hit so many of these that it became funny. I did pick up one while standing waist deep in the ocean.)
- 3 Rainbow Trout (nothing spectacular, but beautiful fish)
- 150+ Dolly Varden (one that was between 23" 25"). I had dropped a 20"er trying to get a picture, so I kept this one in the net There was a notch in this one's back where he had been bitten as a juvenile.)

What was fantastic was that there were three other guys in out group that did as well as I did. We got a bit embarrassed with our success and often came back and told the rest of the lodge that we had caught "a few". That was until Joe our guide had me tell them what I had finished up with. Without thinking I told everyone that the last 10 fish or so had been taken a pair of nymphs (even though he had told us to use streamers and that we wouldn't need our nymphs). I couldn't help it... I had to see if nymphs would work.

As far as the scenery and wildlife... it was unbelievable. We saw bears, buffalo, wild horses, fur seals, eagles, beaver and fox. There were snow covered peaks (when we could see them) and dense fog. We were down by the ocean when then fog rolled in. It stayed for two days, but didn't effect the fishing.

Trying to keep this short, this was one of the few trips that I have taken where after I got back I had to admit that my expectations were more met. Trust me... if you ever have the chance to take a trip like this, DO IT!



Directions:

From I-75 -- Take Exit 14, east, on Glendale-Milford Rd. until the intersection of US 42, (Reading Rd). Turn right (south) on US 42, and RAFFEL'S will be on the left approximately 3/10 mile.

From I-71 -- Take Exit 15, west, Pfeiffer Rd. & this becomes Glendale-Milford Rd.. At the intersection of US 42, (Reading Rd), turn left, (south) on US 42, and RAFFEL'S will be on the left approximately 3/10 mile.
