As I write this note, I am sitting at my dad's house in Youngstown after a cold, rainy/snowy day fishing the Ashtabula and Conneaut for steelhead...unsuccessfully, I might add. Water levels were extremely low yesterday when I was driving up, then we had a small storm system move through overnight and completely blew out the rivers. I was quite unpleasantly surprised to arrive to the Conneaut this morning to find "chocolate milk", and was reminded once again that I should always consult the USGS data sites before making a trip to the water. If you're new to fly fishing, find out from a veteran BUFF member how to access the USGS to find real-time data for almost any stream you'd want to fish. There's a plethora of information available online, and the more effectively you use it, the more likely you are to be in the right place at the right time to land the big one.


Also, with spring rains and high water levels, it's worth a reminder to be careful wading in murky water where you can't see the bottom. Make sure you're familiar with the stream in any area where you plan to wade, and even then remember that streams are always changing. While wading a section of the Mad River in high water a couple years ago, I hopped into the water and started across a sand flat I'd walked across countless times, only to discover that the most recent storms had completely washed out the sand flat and left a 6 foot deep hole where my flat once rested. I know it was 6 feet deep because I'm 5'11" and after my second step onto the missing flat the water was about an inch over my

5'11", and after my second step onto the missing flat, the water was about an inch over my head.

Ohio is now sending a PDF version of the license to you in an email, and allows you to display it on your phone. This is pretty handy if you do find yourself on-stream when you real-



ize you forgot to purchase a license. As long as you've got a decent data connection on your cellular phone, you can buy the license on-stream and be good to go, then print out a paper copy when you get home if you prefer.

Kudos to Bob Gustafson for organizing another pair of white bass trips to Indiana, and to Hugh O'Donnell for taking on the spring steelhead trip. Both are great trips, and great opportunities to get out and learn about our sport from some of the most knowledgeable people around. Also, a HUGE thank you to Todd McGarvey and his Banquet Team for putting together a great banquet last weekend! Not only did they do a great job putting the banquet together, they did it on a shortened timeline, and still managed to put together a recognition ceremony, and a list of prizes and silent auction items extensive enough to make my head spin. A great time was had by all who attended, so thanks again.

We are planning four women's events for BUFF this spring and summer. There will be casting helpers at all the events and we hope to increase our women members who fish. Women should feel comfortable in this fishing environment with other women, some who are experts and some who are just beginning. We encourage all women to participate in these events. All women interesting in learning to fly fish are welcome to come no matter what your ability. Club rods and flies will be available for anyone who needs them. We will start with a casting class, then bank fishing at a farm pond, and end with small stream fishing.

A women's casting clinic will be held before the April 13 regular BUFF meeting from 5-6:30 at the VOA Park. All women interested in learning to cast or just improving their casting are welcome to attend. We will have casting helpers for everyone.

On May 21 we will have a fishing morning in a Butler County farm pond near Oxford from 8:00-10:30. Come early or late. After fishing we will go out for brunch at the local Bob Evans. Helpers will be there for those who have little experience farm pond fishing. Rain day is May 22.

On June 18 we will have a fishing experience on slow moving water, probably Four Mile Creek near Oxford. We will start about 8:30 and go until 10:30 with brunch to follow. It is probably going to be warm enough for wet wading although if you have waders you may want to bring them. Rain day is June 19-yes I know it is Father's Day so hope it doesn't rain. This event depends on the water level in the stream.

On September 10 we will have another fishing experience on the water. After a summer of practice, we will try wading on a small stream. Rain date is September 11. Again, fishing will depend on the level of water in the streams.

Order by April 6 and you will have it at the April meeting.



We have two new books added to the library, ready to be checked out at the April meeting. Both books were donated by the authors.



Service Education Opportunities Abound in 2016 Ed Jones, Public Education Director

After dozens and dozens of volunteers made the Greater Cincinnati Fly Fishing Show and the 2016 BUFF Banquet so highly successful, some of us might think it's time to kick back and rest on our laurels. Wrong! The season for education activities is upon us, and there will be copious opportunities for volunteering in 2016. Volunteering is a great way to "give back" to our marvelous organization and help us meet our mission. It's also a way to make and solidify friendships with fellow Buffers and feel more a part of the organization (BUFF trips help with that, too, but that's another article!).

Most of our public educations services involve the introduction of fly fishing, fly casting, and fly tying to people who unfamiliar with our sport. Our "regular" activities are set for this season. Indian Hill High School typically invites us to teach fly fishing for their outdoor education classes. Parky's Farm is where we help small children catch their first fish and teach families who are new to fishing. Parky's events are usually on May-August Friday mornings. When school is out, we will help fish camps at Lake Isabella include fly fishing in their curriculum. We've been invited again to BugFest at the Cincinnati Museum Center June 4, the VOA's Crazy Cardboard Regatta July 16, Eastern Hills Rod and Gun Club Sporting Women's Day July 16, the Greater Cincinnati Great Outdoor Weekend Sept 24, and Peterloon (Boy Scout Challenge at Camp Friedlander) Oct 8.

The above are examples of what we refer to as public education. We also need volunteers to help with club member education such as casting, tying, rod building, net building, and special on-stream classes. And then there are specific service activities we frequently provide for groups like Project Healing Waters, Casting for Recovery, Reel Recovery or Fishing has no Boundaries. 
