Adventures From the Reel World

Good Fishing, Great Catching

On Tuesday, July 2, 2002, Bruce Wankel picked me up at my camping spot in the Hungry Mother State Park at Marion, Virginia. We drove to Radford, Virginia, where we meet Robert Asbury who provided shuttle service for us. Robert is an avid fly fisher, and he does a lot of fishing on the New River.

We launched Bruce's Hyde drift boat in the New River above Radford. I found the drift boat to be a comfortable fishing platform. Shortly after starting the float, a 7 inch Red Eye (Rock Bass) attached himself to the Sneaky Pete that Bruce had tied onto my line, and the "catching" began. During the several hour float, that popper attracted many fish, over 50, that I hooked and landed. Included were rock bass, large and colorful bluegills, and smallmouth. Many of the smallmouth were in the 13 to 16 inch range, and several, larger than that, were hooked and landed. Three were in excess of 17 inches, and probably weighed more that 3 pounds. I have had many good fishing days, but this one was one of the greatest "catching days" that it has been my pleasure to experience.

Bruce is an excellent guide, very good at handling the boat, and a marvelous person with whom to spend a day. He made a presentation at one of our meetings, and has been an exhibitor at our show. I know that I want to spend another day on the New River with him. •

Our destination was Emigrant, Montana, twenty minutes south of Livingston, Montana, and an hour from Yellowstone National Park. Our base of operation was Tim and Judy Powell's (Cincinnati expatriates) Emigrant cabins on the banks of the Yellowstone River. This was the fourth shop trip to Montana. Well known author/contract tyer Tom Travis spearheaded our Montana guiding and coordinated private access, spring creek rods, etc..

week, but none as prolific as the caddis on the Yellowstone. Carpets of bugs could be scooped up on the river or seen hovering over trees and shrubs. We had three different Drift boats, but the best I can figure it, everyone lost count around 20 fish or so in just the first few hours!

If you are planning to go west this Summer/Fall, there is still plenty of action left as hopper season is just starting. I would be happy to share any information to help you with your trip. We are coordinating it all again in 2003 the first week in August.


