What better way to introduce someone to the great sport of fly fishing than to attend the Greater Cincinnati Fly Fishing Show on Saturday, February 15, 2003. Start by giving them the enclosed brochure and inviting them to come along. This year's Show will have something for everyone. Glenn and Terry Gunn of Lees Ferry, Az. will provide a presentation of their fly fishing adventures as a family. There will be presentations on smallmouth fly fishing, huge rainbows at Lees Ferry and how to get started in fly tying. We will have ongoing demonstrations, exhibitors and seminars on fly tying. Fly shops, equipment rep's, state wildlife resources, clubs, and others will be in the exhibitor area. A Kid's Corner will provide fun and information for our children. This is guaranteed to be more fun than shooting fish in a barrel!!

The price of admission will be only \$10 per person, and children 12 and under are still admitted free. Parking is free. Make sure you bring your friends, family members, and especially kids to the show.

His "river god emerger" is an incredible fly with a phenomenal track record. Dennis is an Umpqua Feather Merchant Fly Designer, 1999 FFF Educator of the year, TU Life Member, Guide for the Ausable, Past President of the West Michigan Chapter of TU, founding member of the Anglers of the Ausable, Member of the Fly Girls, Founder of the Pathological Tiers and a Whiting Farms Pro Team Tier. But, what makes Dennis is not only a great tier, he's also first and foremost a fisherman. Therefore, he will share some of his tricks and techniques for making his world renowned "durable flies." Even if you don't ever intend to tie a fly, or you're brand new to the sport, this is still a meeting you just can't miss. He will show you what to look for in a durable fly, and you will soon learn that all flies are not created equal. He also has a state of the art video display system, so you don't need to worry about not having a great seat to see all the action. And as a very special last minute addition, **Dennis has agreed to conduct a class before the dinner for up to 20 intermediate tiers.** So if you can, be sure to register on the Website, bring your gear and come early, say about 5:00 PM. On Saturday, Jan 11, Jeff Fox Bill Riehle and I attended the TU planning meeting at Spring Run Trout Club in Dayton to discuss the issues concerning the Mad River, and the new projects that are planned for his year.

There will be lots of work days scheduled this year for everyone to get involved with Mad River. We will be scheduling them on Saturdays and Sundays, so everyone has a chance to come along. Some of the projects will be habitat restoration - like placing boulders in the stream and anchoring fallen trees to make happy homes for the resident trout. There will be some base stream monitoring being done in areas where we will be putting habitat to see the before and after effects of the hard work being done.

We discussed putting together a map of the Mad River that will show public access points and areas that are off limits. The maps hopefully will be ready before our Buff Show, and will be sold at the TU booth - along with the Mad river fly box loaded with all the fly's that are needed on the Mad. This is a TU fundraiser to raise money for all the projects that they have planned. It costs money for cable, clips and anchors, and other equipment to do the job right. This will give you a chance to help without ever getting your hands dirty! However, if you want to get your hands dirty, that's fine too!

I'm putting together a Mad winter trip for the end of February. I will have a sign-up list available at the February meeting, and then will coordinate the trip with the interested people. NKFF will also be conducting a trip up to the Mad in February, and so I want to make <u>our</u> trip special. I talked to Tom Frick at the Rusty Drake, and he is willing to open early for us so people can get flys and supplies before we head to the Mad. There will be no excuse this year for not fishing the Mad! I will be your guide for those of you who don't feel comfortable traveling to an unknown place to fish.
