#### Fly Fishing 101/Knot Course

After seeing the high interest for both a basic 101 and a knot course at the January meeting, I've decided to combine the two subjects into a five session course. The first three sessions will focus on rods, reels, lines, leaders, tippets, other equipment needs and casting basics; the final two sessions will focus on line cleaning and knots. The classes will be held from 7 to 9 PM on Thursday nights March 9, 16, 23, 30 and April 6 in the Hopewell Junior High School cafeteria. The junior school is located in the Westchester area near the intersection of I-75 and Tylersville Road (close to the new Voice of America Park). The classes are free and open to all (and only) BUFF members. I'll have the course outline and directions to the school at the February and March meetings as well as listed on the BUFF website. Members are free to come to whichever classes are of interest to them. There will be a course sign-up sheet at the February and March meetings. Although pre sign-up is not necessary to attend any of the classes, if you plan to attend please sign the sheet so I can get a rough idea on how many copies of the class handouts to make.

# **Proposed Club Trip to Montana**

Following Dave Blackburn's excellent talk about NW Montana trout fishing last month, we want to gauge the interest in putting together a club trip to the Kootenai/Glacier National Park area. Since this is a totally new trip for us, we'd like to plan it—dates, accommodations and fishing locations—in conjunction with the folks who want to go. If you are interested in meeting to discuss going on a Montana trip, please send me an email or sign the interest sheet with Patti Howell at the February meeting. Here's a brief overview of what the options for the trip might be:

Split the trip into two sections. Fly/drive into Kalispell. One part would be toward Libby (90 miles west of Kalispell) centered on the Kootenai River using Kootenai Anglers/Dave Blackburn as a main contact. Dave has confirmed a package deal of \$300 per day per person for a full day float trip on the Kootenai, lodging in one of his river-side cabins, and all meals (cont. breakfast, stream lunch, restaurant dinner.) The second part would be in and around Glacier National Park (35 miles east of Kalispell) staying at Apgar Village (nice cabins) within the Park.

#### Fishing Options

Kootenai River Region

- Float trips on the Kootenai—Crystal clear water holding big rainbows, bull trout, and browns.
- <u>Wading on the Kootenai</u>—possible when flows are down in spring and fall.
- <u>Bull River</u>—some access on the last 2 miles. Some nice browns, commonly up to 18". Fish before mid-July.
- <u>Yaak River</u>—more public access than the Bull and is easily waded. Small brookies along with 'bows and 'cuts.
- Rogers Lake—awesome grayling fishing on dry flies possible but a canoe necessary. Best in May or June.
- Little Thompson River—Typical spring creek. Public access along an easy-to-drive dirt logging road.
- <u>Thompson Chain of Lakes</u>—don't know too much about these but reportedly good bass fishing.

#### Glacier Park Area

Guides for local waters available out of Columbia Falls. In general, wading can be done along all forks of the Flathead River. Belly/float boats needed for lake fishing.

- <u>Duck Lake</u>—on the north end of the park. Float fishing for browns. Need Indian reservation permit.
- <u>Flathead River, North Fork</u>—6-12" cuts in the runs and riffles on dries; deep pools holding big bulls and 'bows.
- <u>Murray Lake</u> a nice, super-clear, smallish, secluded lake holding lots of rainbows. Need canoe or float tube.
- <u>Flathead River, South Fork above Flathead Lake</u>—Floating is recommended. Dirt road all along the river for access.
- <u>Glacier Park</u>—it's possible to fish almost anywhere in the park and there are great streams right along major roads, but the trick is to get in to more secluded areas for spectacular fishing. Float tubes are generally recommended and there are hikes of all difficulties available.

There are lots of interesting places to fish in Montana. Supposedly there is nowhere in the state where you are more than six miles from fishable water.

**Fishing licenses:** If you need a fishing license, go west on Turfway to Huston Road (Florence), and go to Walmart. It is easier than procuring a license in the Frankfort area. Should you be taking non-fishing family, stop at the rest stop just north of Georgetown, (on I -75). You can pick up numerous pamphlets on area attractions.

**Eats!** Up to 20 Breakfasts will be provided, by reservation, Saturday at 8:00 a.m. (Coffee, 2 Eggs, 3 sausages, grits, & orange juice for \$2.00.), and up to 20 Suppers, Saturday @ 7:00 p.m. by reservation. 

#### **Directions:**

From I-275 – Take Exit 46, (US 42), south for three miles to Glendale-Milford Rd. --Continue south and RAFFEL'S will be on the left approximately 3/10 mile.

From I-75 -- Take Exit 14, east, on Glendale-Milford Rd. until the intersection of US 42, (Reading Rd). Turn right (south) on US 42, and RAFFEL'S will be on the left approximately 3/10 mile.

From I-71 -- Take Exit 15, west, Pfeiffer Rd. & this becomes Glendale-Milford Rd.. At the intersection of US 42, (Reading Rd), turn left, (south) on US 42, and RAFFEL'S will be on the left approximately 3/10 mile.
