The 2023 BUFF Banquet is scheduled in lieu of our regular March monthly meeting. The Banquet will be held at the Oasis Center (our regular meeting location) from 6:00 – 9:00 PM. Registration and payment for the dinner is required to attend. Registration is NOW available on the BUFF Website. You can register directly on the website, or print a paper registration form to mail in with your check.

Menu -

The dinner entrée will offer a choice of chicken roulade or baked salmon with salad, rolls and butter, roasted potatoes and southern-style green beans. There will be appetizers served before the meal, as well as desserts and coffee. There will be a cash bar, of course, as well. Cost for the banquet meal is \$40 per person, and is paid when you register.

The Banquet is BUFF's Major Yearly Fund Raising Event –

Funds raised at the Banquet go to support many of the club's outside and charitable activities. Funds are raised through various silent auctions and raffles held at the event. Silent auctions items are most often fishing related, and usually include trips and guide services. General Raffle items are often more diverse and are mostly donations from club members. Current Grand Raffle items for this year include a Jeff Ruby dinner, a spa, and wine bucket combination, and a Thomas & Thomas 9.5 ft. 9 WT rod and reel combo, and possibly more to come. Raffle tickets are priced at \$5/ticket for the General Raffle and \$10/ticket for the Grand Raffle items. Raffle tickets can be purchased at the time of registration and/or at the Banquet.

The BUFFER became the regular newsletter for the club in the early 1990's, replacing an earlier, newsletter, "Tight Lines" that was started shortly after the club formed. Joe also was our first 'webmaster', initiating and launching the club's website in 1998.

As a member Joe was named Fly Fisher of the Year in 1999 and was awarded Lifetime Membership in 2006. He was one of only 12 current members who have received this recognition. We extend our condolences to Joe's family and friends.


Spring White Bass Fishing

Each spring, in late-April to early-May the club has local trips on the Whitewater River in Indiana for the spring white bass spawning run. This occurs over a time period of only a few weeks. It is a trip where an angler can hook a lot of fish. One of last year's participants caught over 100 white bass in a day!

Bob Gustafson is the organizer. This year the plan is to have a total of 5 trips. Two will be reserved BUFF members who have not done this outing before and who are new to the club. Updates and registration will be on the website as time gets closer.

Dave Whitlock – Major Figure in Fly-Fishing Passes Away

Dave Whitlock, often considered 'everyman's fly-fishing mentor' passed away at the age of 88 in November 2022. He lived in Oklahoma, in the Ozark Mountains, and the rivers and streams of this area were among his favorites to fish. He was an accomplished fly tyer, developing flies such as Dave's Hopper, NearNuff Crayfish, and the Sheep Minnow Series. Dave was well published, with many articles in fly fishing magazines, as well as several books. Among his books were the L.L. Bean Fly Fishing Handbook, Dave Whitlock's Guide to Aquatic Trout Foods, and Trout, Char and Salmon, and the Classic Flies that Catch Them. Dave had a long professional association with L.L. Bean, running fly fishing schools operated by the company in the



1980's. He was also an accomplished artist, focusing of course on aquatic themes. After watching trout swimming in a clear stream when fishing in Montana, he purchased a snorkeling mask so he could observe them underwater for his art.

Dave took a gentlemanly approach to fly fishing. In the L.L. Bean Handbook, published in 1983, he wrote, "Do not crowd other anglers..... If you have a good spot and you notice other anglers waiting for a chance to fish it, either give up the spot after you have fished it for a while or invite them to share the water with you". Another of his adages stated "When you hook or lose a fish, refrain from loud speech, profanity, screaming, or other noises that interfere with others' serenity". Things we should all strive to do. Dave has also been highly recognized by FFI over the years. FFI recognized his efforts and skills with numerous awards for his contributions in fly tying conservation work, and promotion of the sport and etiquette of fly fishing.

Dave was not a stranger to BUFF either. In 2002 he was the keynote speaker at our Banquet and the headliner at the BUFF Fly-Fishing Show. At that time, the banquet and fly fishing show were scheduled together.

Fishing the Tuckasegee River

Tom Bachey shared an article from the January 2023 edition of "The Angler Video Magazine, an E-zine. The article is by Shannon Messer of the Tuckasegee Fly Shop on fishing the Tuckasegee River, a great tailwater trout stream in Western NC. The folks from the shop are regular exhibitors at our fly fishing show, and Shannon has done fly tying demonstration at past shows.

The Tuckasegee is a tailwater trout fishery in western NC. From October 1 – early June there is delayed-harvest fishing which is restricted to catch-and-release using artificial lures and a single hook. The restriction applies to 5.5 miles of the river passing by the towns of Dillsboro, Sylva, and Cullowhee. The Tuck is a stocked river, with this region receiving over 90,000 trout, 80% rainbow and book trout and the rest brown trout, annually. The trout are usually about 12" when stocked, but much larger fish are in the water as well.



There are numerous access points where one can wade or fish from a drift boat. The Tuck is part of the North Carolina Mountain Heritage Trout Waters program. For this program, anglers can obtain a special 3-day license for \$5 for fishing the river! A regular license for out of state residents, which allows access to all waters is only \$33 for a10-day license, and \$51 for a yearly license. The fees include a required trout stamp. Jackson County, which includes this section of the Tuck has over 4,500 miles of trout streams offering a mixture of stocked and wild trout fishing. There is an official "Fly Fishing Trail" in the county (www.flyfishingtrail.com). Hence, the regular license may be a better choice as it would allow fishing on waters other than the Tuckasegee only.

Yellowstone Anglers' Basecamp Registration is Open

Yellowstone Anglers' Basecamp is located at Camp Buffalo Bill, a Boy Scout Camp along the banks of the North Fork of the Shoshone River, just 8 miles from the East Entrance of Yellowstone National Park in Wyoming. This experience provides a non-scouting opportunity for fly fishing clubs and individual anglers to experience some of the best fly fishing in the world at a very affordable price.



When:

The camp runs weekly for 5 consecutive weeks, starting the week of August 6, 2023. Anglers can reserve their choice of week(s) at this spectacular fishing destination. The camp capacity is 30 anglers per week. Reservation directions are provided later in this section.

Week 1: Aug 6 - Aug 12 - This is the week being held for BUFF anglers to head West this summer for the Anglers Base Camp. If you want to experience fishing for trout in the beautiful mountains of the American west, together with fellow club members, this is a trip to consider.

If you cannot make it for this week, and still want to do the trip, you can register for any of the other weeks as well.

Week 2: Aug 13 - Aug 19: WOMEN ONLY

Week 3: Aug 20 – Aug 26 Week 4: Aug 27 – Sept Week 5: Sept 3 – Sept 9

Cost:

• The cost of the camp is \$900 per person per week all inclusive.

What is included:

- 3 full, hot meals a day prepared by our onsite chef, plus all the snacks and fruit you can eat.
- Lodging in cabins or rooms located in buildings on the grounds of Camp Buffalo Bill.
- Central bathhouse and some private rooms for couples with private bathrooms and showers.
- There are 4 campsites for recreational vehicles with electric and water. Black water waste disposal is available at the camp.
- Laundry facilities.
- Transportation to and from just about any fly-fishing destination in the region.
- Transportation to and from Yellowstone Regional Airport in Cody, WY. If you want to fly into Billings, MT, check the registration website regarding shuttle transportation arrangements.

Participants should bring:

- Sleeping Bag or Sheets/Blankets
- Personal Toiletries & amp; towel
- Fishing Tackle
- A detailed packing guide will be supplied to all those who register for the camp.

Fishing Licenses:

Anglers must purchase Wyoming and/or Yellowstone Fishing Licenses. Fishing within Yellowstone National Park requires their license. Anglers must also be aware of and abide by local fishing regulations. For example, there could be different regulations for fishing in the Park than outside of it.

North Fork Shoshone River:

The Shoshone River is one of the finest blue ribbon, freestone trout fisheries in the country. The 52 mile stretch of the Shoshone River between Cody, Wyoming and the east entrance to Yellowstone is referred to locally as the North Fork. Teddy Roosevelt called the Northe Fork "the most scenic 52 miles in America". Native Yellowstone cutthroat trout, rainbow trout, mountain whitefish, brook trout and brown trout can all be caught from public land access sites along its entire border.
