Just Say NO! Drugs Are A Problem For Fish As Well

A few months ago I wrote a story about "What is in your medicine cabinet?" In the article I talked about the 2002 USGS Open-File Report 02-94 which conducted a survey of 139 streams in 30 states with 8 of those sample locations in Missouri. What they found was 95 different pharmaceutical chemical were making it into streams either by surviving the human bodily systems or by being flushed down the drain.

In a follow up story from Nature.com, the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) has started using laboratory experiments to determine how those pharmaceuticals react with chlorine, a commonly used disinfectant used the treatment of waste water. In an effort to mimic the wastewater treatment system they exposed four different drugs to chlorine for a time period of 1 hour. What they found was surprising. The common drug acetaminophen (Tylenol) formed a number of different chemicals, two of which are known to be toxic. And one of the most unusual aspect noticed was the chemical byproducts of the treatment tended to be more "Hydrophobic" that the parent material. These hydrophobic chemicals are more likely to build up in the system.

So what is the answer? Early research from Baylor University show that typical treatment facilities do not effectively remove the drugs and hormones from the wastewater effluent and low levels are released as well as some byproducts. More advanced, water reclamation plants, which use micro-filters and reverse osmosis technology, were found to do a better job, but neither system is perfect. Right now, technology allows low level contaminates to be detected in the environment, but the toxicology studies have not caught up and their effects on the ecosystem are unknown.

What does this mean to the fly fishermen? Maybe not much, but the research is expected to be increased on wastewater treatment and the by-products will become more and more important as fish toxicology is studied.

So, how do you get rid of those 7-year-old Tylenol pills or that 9 months worth of unused birth control pills, you have lying around? Some local pharmacies will accept expired or unused medications for environmentally responsible disposal. But be aware not everything is accepted. Below is a list of normally accepted and not accepted items. Check with your local pharmacist and see what they will or will not take.

Accepted:

- All prescription drugs
- Nonprescription medications
- Acne therapies
- Athlete's foot treatments
- Vitamin and mineral supplements
- Throat lozenges

Not accepted:

- Contact lens disinfectants
- Antidandruff products and shampoos
- Cosmetics, antiperspirants, antiseptic or medicated skin care products
- Sunburn protectants
- Mouthwashes and toothpastes


