He has worked locally for the Clermont Soil & Water Conservation District, the Cincinnati Nature Center, and then established Brownknight EcoResource LLC, a company devoted to land and water conservation. Jason is passionate about the Little Miami Conservancy organization, furthering the goal of a ‘win-win’ position with local stakeholders including local and state governments, and developers to ensure the Little Miami National Wild and Scenic River continues to provide a healthy environment for all fish and wildlife. In doing so, the river adds to the beauty of its surrounding communities, who continue to benefit from it has to offer.

2022 Cincinnati Fly Fishing Show – January Update

The Cincinnati Fly Show team continues working on the 2022 show. **The date is Saturday, February 4th, 2022.**

Mark your calendars and plan to attend.

Headline Presenter – George Daniel –

As most of us are aware, George Daniel will be our headliner at the 2023 show. George has been chasing anything that swims with his fly rod since age 6 and still has the same passion 37 years later. He has competed at a high level for Fly Fishing Team USA, earning individual back-to-back US National Fly Fishing Championship titles and ranked as high as 5th in World Competition, and won other regional and national fly fishing competitions over the years. George has also served as captain for Fly Fishing Team USA and Coach for the US Youth Fly Fishing Team.



While no longer active at competitive fly fishing, George now focuses on what he enjoys most, teaching fly fishing, as he considers himself a teach first, and a fly fisher second. He has authored three best-selling fly fishing books, dozens of articles for fly fishing publications, and has numerous video presentations available on line. He travels to present at clubs and fly fishing shows, and conduct teaching workshops. He is an expert in Euro Nymphing, and that will be one of the topics he presents at our show.

Fly Tying Workshops – Friday, February 4th



On the Friday prior to the show, we have scheduled three, hands-on, fly-tying workshops, led by our headliner, George Daniel. Each session will tie a different group of flies:

- ***“Streamers”*** – 9 AM – 11:30 AM. This workshop will tie a “Sculp Snack Jig”, Sparkle Minnow Jig”, and “Verlac Wedge Head” (single hook)” flies.
- ***“Euro Nymphs”*** – 1 PM – 3:30 PM. This workshop will tie a “Gasolina Jig”, “SOS Jig”, and “Sulpher/PMD Perdigon” flies.
- ***“Conventional Nymphs”*** – 4 PM – 6PM. This workshop will tie a “Tan Caddis CDC Pupa” and a “Simple Bead Head Pheasant Tail” flies

Each workshop is limited to 24 participants, and, at the time I am writing this, they are almost full. If interested check the BUFF website to determine what openings remain available. **Cost is \$30 for 1, \$50 for 2, and \$70 to register for all 3 workshops. Registration is on the BUFF website**

The Banquet is BUFF's Major Fund Raising Event – Need for Raffle Donations

The Banquet is BUFF's major fund raising event. Funds raised go to support many of the club's outside and charitable activities. Funds are raised through the various silent auctions and raffles held at the event. Silent auctions items are most often fishing related, and usually include trips and guide services.

General Raffle and Grand Raffle items are often more diverse and are mostly donations from club members.

Raffle tickets are priced at \$5/ticket for the General Raffle and \$10/ticket for the Grand Raffle items. Raffle tickets can be purchased at the time of registration and/or at the Banquet.

It is vital to have a good number of items to raffle. While items can be fishing related, that is not a requirement, and having a diversity of items is preferable. Examples of non-fishing items include: hand-crafted items, artwork, home and personal services (e.g., housecleaning, photographic services), vouchers (e.g., restaurants, golf at a members course, store vouchers, etc.), or other items which club members can bid on. If you are a regular customer at a local business, you may want to contact them to see if they would donate a service as a raffle item. Many local businesses are happy to support these activities. Please consider offering a raffle item to the club for the Banquet.
