Things are beginning to change with the Federation of Fly Fishers. After many years struggling to meet its promise of being an influential voice in the world of fly fishing and conservation, the leadership of FFF has been restructured and a renewed sense of energy is emerging.

The FFF website (www.fedflyfishers.org) has been totally revamped and now includes sections on coldwater, warm water, saltwater and international fly fishing. There are dedicated sections on education, conservation, and the certified casting instructors program. Future improvements will include a members only section and a guide association (guide database). Check it out! You can find a link to the FFF website from B.U.F.F.'s website (under the Links section).

There is a new membership incentive program in place now. Anyone who joins FFF (\$29 / year individual membership; \$35 / year family membership) will receive a grab bag containing at least \$50 worth of fly fishing materials. The 40th Annual International Fly Fishing Show and Conclave will be held on August 11-13, 2005 in Livingston, Montana. Aquatic Insect Study and the Fly Fisher

Many people do not realize the close correlation of fly-fishing and insect study (or entomology). When you go fly-fishing you use a rod, reel, line and the all-important fly to lure a fish to strike. The fly is most often designed to mimic an insect or its larvae. But to make a fly that will catch a fish it must be accurately made to fit the description of the insect larvae it is meant to portray.

This is where entomology comes in. You can make flies that *somewhat* mimic a larva; but to catch a fish the fly has to look good enough for a fish to eat it. And that can sometimes be very difficult! Insects come in a myriad of shapes, colors, and sizes. They've inhabited almost every habitat in the world: deserts, jungles, snow plains, forests, fresh and even saltwater. Therefore, to accurately portray an insect in the form of a lure some study is needed to accustom yourself with its habitat, behavior and life cycle.

To do this you're going to have to go on a field trip to find the little critters that you may have some questions about. But wait! First you're going to need a few things. You'll need to collect equipment for the habitat you're going to visit. Let's say that you're a little curious about stonefly larvae; they live in freshwater streams. So you should bring waders, a dipnet, a notebook, a camera, a thermometer, an identification guide, and a couple jars.

So now what? What do you do with this stuff? Well, put on your waders and I'll explain what to do next. Got them on? Good. Okay, wade out to that riffle and start turning over rocks, scooping with the net underneath them as you go. Now take the stuff you get and dump it into a jar full of water. If you're lucky there will be some stonefly larvae inside.

Use your ID guide to identify what kind (or *species*) of stonefly that the larvae are. Now jot down in your notebook details such as these: where you found it, when, what part of the habitat you found it in, behavior, coloration, appearance and the air and water temperature. Now take a picture of your stonefly larvae and release them back into the stream. Now you know *for sure* what a stonefly larva looks like, how it behaves in its habitat and where that habitat is

You can also use these same recording techniques to study adult stoneflies. All you would need to change is the equipment needed. Bring a large butterfly net to catch the adults and plastic bags or envelopes to place them in for study.

Now that you've learned all about stoneflies, you know what to look out for when buying (or making) flies for your tackle box. So next time you go fishing you can count on having the best most realistic flies. And when you're flies look right to you; they're going to look delicious to the fish!

Editor's Note: Ethan is 15, and a 4H member for the last ten years. 

Directions:
