Fishing on the Elkhorn

After a nice day on the river on Saturday, some good catches, a wonderful steak dinner, a lot of great fellowship, some fish stories and then a good nights sleep, we are up and at them with great anticipation of catching the "Big One" on Sunday.

The weather is outstanding again on Sunday on the Elkhorn River, sunny, just a slight breeze, and a nice flow to the river. Things started out very slow around 8:30AM with only a few small catches of 6 to 7 inch Smallmouth Bass and Bluegill. We try nearly everything in our arsenal of flies from Poppers to Streamers to Brown and Black Spiders and trailers of the infamous Don Hogue taught Red Fox Squirrels, to flies we don't yet remember the names. Something had to give as I just felt something had to be in one of our so called "honey holes". It is almost noon now, the back is getting a little tired, the legs a little wearier, and the hopes of catching the Big One today is beginning to fade. Oh, what the heck, I think I will try a Black Wooly Bugger, something I just do not seem to have much luck with, so I add a Red Fox Squirrel trailer. First cast and boom, something major league has hit, it dives and runs, and I play it for about ten minutes, finally realizing it is a pretty nice size Catfish. Yes, I am going to finally get to use my Fly Fishing Net that I made at the Paul Feldman net building class. Thank God I was using the 7 weight Shelbyville Rod I purchased at the BUFF Fly Fishing Show, and not my 5 weight that I built at John Doscher's class. I hit into a Catfish last year with the 5 weight, and probably due to lack of experience, immediately snapped it in two places and had to rebuild it. Chris hears me hooting it up and comes to my rescue, grabbing my beautiful walnut and ash handmade net and after some additional maneuvering we finally net it. It was big, it was fat, and it measured slightly over 24 inches. It swallowed the Red Fox Squirrel (Sorry Don, it was not retrievable) and the Black Wooly Bugger was well entrenched in his mouth. After a bit of a struggle getting the fly out and a re-measure just to be sure of its length, we released it for someone else to have a nice fight on another day.

Well, I figured even though we had really wrestled with this one and thrashed up the water a bit, I figured I would cast again into the same hole with just the Black Wooly Bugger. Wham, I hit another nice fish, this time a solid 13" Smallmouth Bass that had some nice fight in it. Yes, I got to use my net again, and now I am even more elated as I actually got a Bass in the net.

What the heck, I may as well cast in again. One strip of the line and whack, another fish hits. This time I see it pretty quick, it is another feisty Catfish. It tugs, dives, runs, and rolls like crazy. Apparently there was something in that Wooly Bugger it just did not like. After a nice tussle, we net it. It is a solid 14" and provided lots of fun.

We can hardly believe that we pulled three fish out of the same hole in such a short period of time. After I let the hole settle for awhile, I try again, but I think we have stirred that "honey hole" up enough for today. Chris is obviously as excited as I am, although just a little envious as her catches were limited to some smaller Bass and Bluegill, although again she saw some nice size Bass. She will recount the numerous varieties of birds and the sounds they made which always gives her lots of enjoyment on a day on the river. We move on with a little less luck, but with some great memories again of the Don/Doug sponsored Elkhorn River Trip.

BUFF Trout Magic 2007 – Spring Nantahala River Trip Frank Layher

It was an early sunny morning in a small café in Bryson City, North Carolina, as 40 BUFF members came together to listen to Randy Clark's instruction about how to fish the Nantahala this year. The day before some BUFF's had caught up to 20 trout and they shared their secrets about the patterns they have used with us. So, packed with good advices and a great breakfast we entered the Nantahala National Forrest and drove up the very steep and narrow valley to catch a lot of big trouts.

However, it was tougher than everyone expected. The trout were shy and the trees were so close that we not only almost lost our patience, but also almost lost all our flies. Nevertheless, we continued varying patterns and adjusting tippets, and in the end everyone had great success or at least was able to change patterns blind. After such a hard day of fishing everyone looked forward for our joint dinner in the Deep Creek Campground Pavilion with the setting sun on the horizon and a cold beer in our hands. Great ribs, beans and excellent cakes topped the perfect day off.

Then a fire was lighted and the traditional ultimate contest started. The disciplines were: "Best Fishing Story", "First Fish", "Largest Fish", "Smallest Fish" and "Most Fish". Again it was a hard fight and the judges had a lot of work, because the overall champion in 3 of 5 categories, David French, was restricted to attend only in one category. He decided to focus on the "Most Fish Award" and won it with an amount of 15 trout on Friday (his total of the weekend was 44!). Furthermore he was very happy to receive an artificial trout trophy, after he had to release his 22 inches brown trout which he had caught this day. Jerry Schatzmann followed the approach "The early fisherman catches the fish" and so he won in the category "First Fish". The "Best Fish Story" was told by Tom Warren in the eyes of the auditorium after a lot of applause. He almost lost his friend 's remote control, but luckily he caught it back with his net. The category "Size" was decided between Bob Miller and Charlie Montgomery whereas Bob had won the award for the "Smallest Fish"; only twice the length of his fly, and Charlie had won the "Largest" prize for his 16 inch trout. Furthermore, two new BUFF members caught their first trout; one of them won the privilege of writing this article.

After the ceremony, Randy Clark unfortunately pronounced that he and his assistants will retire after this trip. They made a really good job in the last few years – thanks again from all BUFF members which ever had great fishing days through your perfect organization. In the next years Keith Armstrong and his assistant Tim Findley will organize the Nantahala trip.

The nights were short, but again the weather was perfect on the remaining days of the weekend and so every one of us had great fun out in the water. Some of us went out to other spots, but again one had to work hard to catch an in demand trout. To wrap the trip up, it was a great organized weekend with lots of trouts, sun and especially fun.

2007 NATIONAL CASTING CHAMPIONSHIPS IN GREATER CINCINNATI, OHIO

Many incredible casts, in terms of distances or accuracy, will be made by some of the world's finest casters, but no fish will be caught for this is a tournament that will decide the 2007 North American casting champions.

The 99th American Casting Association (ACA) National Casting Tournament will take place in Greater Cincinnati, Ohio July 30 through August 4, 2007 and will be hosted by the Cincinnati Casting Club.

Casters will come from all over the United States and Canada to compete for trophies, medals and prizes in distance and accuracy events in the traditional ACA competition that dates back to the mid 1800s.

Several of the champs can cast a fly cast more than 200 feet using specialized equipment. That's two-thirds of a football field! One of the most incredible distance casting accomplishments was when Steve Rajeff cast a 1/4 oz. weight 325 feet with a spinning outfit at the 2002 National! A $\frac{1}{4}$ ounce is equivalent to the weight of $1\frac{1}{2}$ sheets of 8.5" x 11" stationery paper.

For the accuracy events, 30-inch floating targets are placed at various distances. It often takes a perfect score, or close to it, to win some events at a National. For the plug-accuracy games, targets are placed 40 to 80 feet. In the fly-accuracy events the targets are from 20 to 50 feet. The Bass Bug targets are from 20 to 70 feet.

The accuracy games will be held at Cincinnati Central Turners Lake, whereas the distance events will take place at Lebanon Sports Complex. The Kirkwood Inn at Mason, OH is the host hotel.

The schedule is as follows: July 30 – Practice Day. July 31 and August 1 –Distance Events. August 2, 3 and 4 –Accuracy Games. August 4 (evening) –Awards Banquet at the Houston Inn.

Many of today's tackle advancements and casting techniques can be directly attributed to tournament casting. It was the tournament casters who developed aluminum spools for casting reels, weight-forward fly line tapers, shooting lines, the double-haul fly casting method, feathering an open-face spinning reel for pinpoint accuracy, the fly line calibration system, hook size standards and many other features that are commonly used by anglers today.

Directions:
