### Adventures From the Reel World

#### In Memorial

**Edward (Red) Lose**, a Life Member of BUFF and a member since the second year of the existence of BUFF, died 15 February, 2003. "Red", as he was known to all, was a passionate fly fisherman who thoroughly enjoyed the sport. What follows are excerpts from an article Red wrote for the Buffer in September 2000, entitled "The Pretty Girl Sings".

I grew up in a farming community in northeastern Indiana. It was flatter than Kansas, hotter than Phoenix, colder than Alaska, and wetter than Seattle. Every spring, the fields were flooded because the ditches, creeks and rivers could not carry the excess water away fast enough. This resulted in a monumental silting of topsoil that muddied the waters making their visibility about two inches at best, ever. I had seen pictures of sparkling clean water and men fishing for trout that could be seen deep in the waters. It became my dream that someday I could experience what those pictures suggested.

My first try at trout fishing was a small stream small enough to step over called Bloody Run in northern Indiana. One day I drove there, but I found it to have more rattlesnakes than trout, and never wet a line. Next I tried Cedar Creek near Ft. Wayne where the state had started an experimental planting of trout. Visibility here was about a foot. I caught no trout, but I did take home several smallmouth bass.......

......At the next BUFF meeting I was telling Ike Hayes about my disappointing trout trip. Ike advised me to next try the Holy Waters of the Ausable near Grayling, Michigan. That's where I went the next summer. It was like walking thru the gates of heaven to find a river so beautiful, so clear, so "just as I had hoped for". There was only one lodge on the twenty mile stretch and I was fortunate to manage to get a room for a week there..... I have been returning there a couple times each year for the past twenty years. Once in the spring to fish and once in October to enjoy the beauty of the hardwood tree leaves that line the banks.

Meantime the club had discovered the Mad River, and, because of its proximity, fished that place religiously for several years before managing to get to the western rivers. The western rivers are fun. You can catch a lot of fish with less effort, so little that sometimes it borders on the monotonous. My biggest objection to the elite streams is that they seem to be getting too expensive for my retirement income. I was just recalling how many places that trout fishing has taken me. I counted six different states and twenty-six different rivers, and I am not ready to "hang it up" yet.

Of all of these places, however, I would consider the Mad River to be my favorite stream. That's probably because it's the quickest for me to get to, and I know the holes and runs better. I don't always catch fish, but there's so much more to fishing than just fish.

Goodbye, Red, and tight lines always!

## Relationship Between Watershed Protection and the Health of the Trout Fishery on the Mad River

On Saturday, November 16, Miami Valley Flyfishers (MVFF) and the Madmen Chapter of Trout Unlimited (Madmen) held the first Mad River Fishing Tournament/Survey. Phil Granato of MVFF and Mark Blauvelt, President of Madmen organized the event. Twenty-seven people participated. Though it was run like a contest, it provided a "snapshot" survey of the health of the fishery. Prizes were awarded for catching the biggest trout and the most trout over 9inches. The watershed strategic plan has established an objective of having more and bigger trout available for the enjoyment of anglers. So, during the tournament participants counted and measured only those trout that have been in the river at least a year (9 inches or longer). Teams of two or three were assigned to fish twelve different areas of the river. Nine of the twelve teams caught forty trout over 9-inches. The winners for the largest trout caught were Phil Martin for catching a fifteen-inch brown trout, and Rob Messick for catching a twelve and one quarter inch brown trout. Several others caught browns over 12 inches. Participants measured and released all of the trout carefully and quickly.

Many of the watershed protection priority objectives, such as establishing buffers, improving the riparian areas, protecting ground and surface water quality are important elements in assuring the health and vitality of the fishery. Our current in-stream habitat improvement efforts have made a difference. Fly fishing clubs and Trout Unlimited have supported the Mad River Steering Committee in creating model projects at SR 36 and the Roger Watson property on Sullivan Road. These projects exemplify all of the key elements necessary for protecting the watershed.

We are privileged to have this resource. If we want to keep it, we all have an obligation to respect the rights of landowners and support the watershed protection efforts.


