2006 FLY FISHING 101/KNOT TYING COURSE

The BUFF education committee will provide a free fly fishing 101/knot tying course for "club-members-only" starting in March. The course will encompass 5 classes to be held from 7 to 9 PM Thursday evenings on March 9, 16, 23, 30 and April 6. . The classes will be held at Hopewell Junior High School, 8200 Cox Road, in West Chester (near the Tylersville Road/I-75 interchange). The course content is designed for beginners as well as intermediate skilled fly fishers. Pre-registrations is requested (but not required) for those planning to attend classes. Course Outline:

- Class 1 (Mar. 9): Rods, reels, lines and backing.
- Class 2 (Mar. 16): Casting basics.
- Class 3 (Mar. 23): Leaders, tippets and other equipment needs.
- Class 4 (Mar 30): Fly line cleaning and knot basics.
- Class 5 (Apr. 6): Hands-on knot tying practice.

(Note: a class is cancelled on any day the Lakota School District is closed for bad weather!)

Directions to Hopewell Junior School

- From the intersection of I-275 and I-75

Take I-75 North toward Dayton about 6 miles to exit 22 (Tylersville Road/Mason exit). Turn right and go to Cox Rd. (second traffic light; about 0.4 miles). Turn right onto Cox and proceed about 0.6 miles to the junior school which is on the left. There is a one-way drive around the school. You need to drive around the back to get to the front of the school. Come in the front entrance; we will meet in the cafeteria.

- From the east side of Cincinnati.

Take I-275 west to exit 46 (Sharonville/Mason exit; Rt 42). Turn right and go about 2.6 miles to Cox Rd. (There is a Dairy Queen and two water towers near to the intersection. Turn left onto Cox road and go about 1.5 miles to the junior school. (Note: you will pass Hopewell Elementary just before you get to Hopewell Junior.) There is a one-way drive around the junior school. Follow the drive around the back to get to the front entrance. Come in the front entrance; we will meet in the cafeteria.

Nantahala River Trip

Trout Magic – May 5 – 7, 2006

If this trip is anything like those in the past – no one will be disappointed. The water and the trout are calling. Already over 35 people have signed up, and there is no limit to the number of participants. Here is some information that should be helpful and the calendar of events for this fabulous trip:



When you sign-up you will receive a Trip Packet that will include all the information you need. Also, this information is posted on our web site.



Typical questions include:

Where is the Nantahala River and how do I get there?

The Nantahala River is near Bryson City, North Carolina. Bryson City is 15 miles Southwest of Cherokee, North Carolina. Cherokee is on the southern border of the Great Smokey Mountains National Park. Plan on a 6-hour drive. Directions and maps are in the Trip Packet.

Where will I Stay?

There are several motels and campgrounds in the area. A list is in the Packet. However, "Deep Creek Campground" will be our base of operations. All 8 of their cabins are being held for BUFF; they also have camper as well as tent sites. The cabins are extra nice and the price is very reasonable. The Packet contains the campground's flyer describing all the accommodations so that each party can make their own reservations. Deep Creek Campgrounds has agreed to hold all the cabins for BUFF until April 1.

What is the cost?

We are asking each person to pay \$15.00; that covers the group dinner on Friday night as well as your name badge and prizes to be awarded at the campfire. You are on your own for your food, lodging, personal items, etc. You will, however, need a North Carolina Fishing License (3 day = \$15 & 1 year = \$30) and a Trout Stamp (\$10 – good for a year)

 **April 12** – BUFF Meeting – We will have a brief informal meeting of the group immediately following the formal meeting to answer any last minute questions. We will also see if there are people who would like to pair up for traveling. Nametags will be handed out.

 **May 4** – Thursday – Travel to Bryson City – Take your time & take in the scenery. Maybe stop by either “Lowe’s Fly Shop” in Waynesville, NC. Or one of the stores in Bryson City to get your license, maybe buy a few flies and get advice from locals. You might even have time to fish.

 **May 5** – Friday – We will have an early morning group breakfast at “Family Restaurant - Ma Barkers” and an orientation meeting. We will try identifying those new trout fishers who might like some help fishing the Nantahala. In the evening there will be a group dinner catered by the campground in their pavilion and a campfire that night to tell our fish stories of the day.

 **May 6** – Saturday - Fish the Nantahala or any of the other “friendly waters” in the area.

 **May 7** – Sunday – Travel home (maybe take the scenic route through the Great Smokey Mountains and visit Gatlinburg. You could also stop and fish one or several of the many the streams in the National Park since your North Carolina fishing license is good there as well.

Sore Elbows

I learned my lesson this past year. No matter how good of shape you are in, or how strong you are; bad casting habits can wreak havoc on your tendons. Why is it that the first casts of the day are smooth and effortless? Everything goes just right. Then gradually you fall apart. Your back cast hits the water, your fly falls way shy of your intended target, and most of your time is spent untangling knotted leaders and fly lines.

Believe me, this has been my own experience lately. And to top it off, both of my elbows are killing me. I can attribute some of my soreness to casting saltwater rods with heavy shooting heads. But I really believe the cause is "overpowering the cast".

And why do we overpower? Human nature I suppose. Or maybe just simply put, anxiety. I can't tell you how many times I have become overly excited by a rising trout or the sight of bait being eaten in the surf. My adrenalin kicks in and before I know it, my casting stroke falls apart.

Overpowering the cast does three things to me. It kills my timing. I forget to stop the rod on both the back and forward cast. And I strain my elbow tendons.

What I need to do is "back off a bit" and wait a few more seconds before I make the cast. I need to take a few more breaths and then make a calculated smooth effortless cast, instead of jamming the rod through the casting stroke and losing the rod load and line speed. I am going to take my seven weight to the high school football field and figure out how much effort is really needed to consistently cast a fly line sixty feet or more.

There is that magic "Zone of Comfort" that we need to learn through practice and practice and more practice. So take it from "Sore Elbows Jim" - A smooth easy casting stroke with firm stops on the back and forward casts will save your tendons and send your fly to its intended target

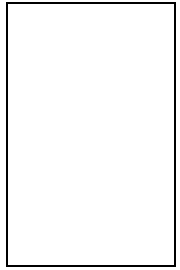

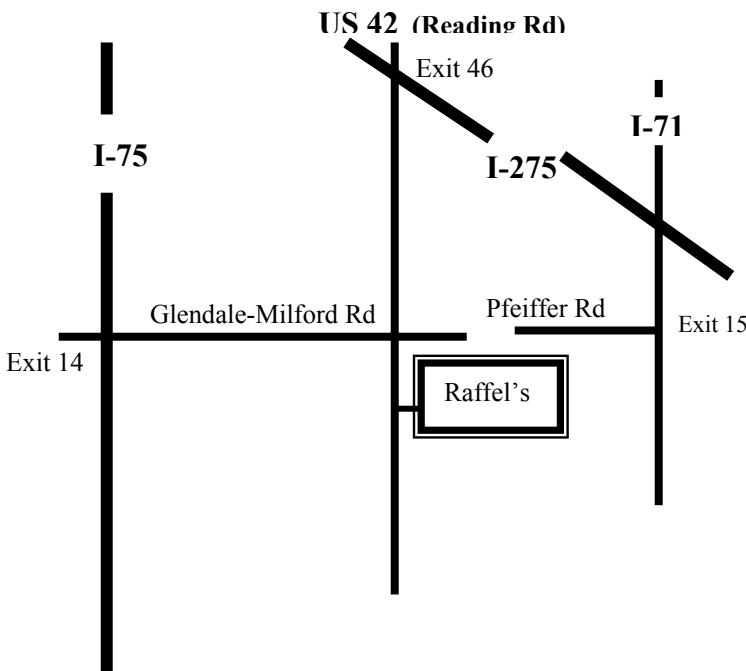

Directions:
