## 2025 Fly Fishing Show Recap

The 2025 Greater Cincinnati Fly Fishing Show is done. Good news is it was a success! Team members have had many comments from attendees, exhibitors, and vendors applauding the show, and the positive experiences they had interacting with our team members, volunteers and show attendees. We've already had several vendors asking to 'sign up' for next year.

Our other good news is that we did not lose money; we made a small profit of about \$100! To be frank, our team was not expecting this. Back last May, the contract we received from Oasis, increased their venue cost by over 40%. We had no prior indication of a cost increase, and It left us no choice, as it was too late to even start seeking an alternative venue. Other costs increased as well. We partly compensated for this by increasing our booth fees for paying vendors, but still we did not expect to break even for the 2025 show.

Attendance was good, with total 'gate' attendance of 783. This was about 100 fewer than gate attendance at the 2024 show. In addition, we had over 150 people at the show as vendors, exhibitors, and invited clubs and tyers. Finally, we had over 70 BUFF members who volunteered to help with the show. We thank all of those who attended, volunteered and participated to make this a great event!

We also want to thank the several organizations who participated in the show. These included -

- Ohio Council of Fly Fishers International
- Mad River Chapter of Trout Unlimited, our regional TU chapter
- The Ohio and Indiana DNR which provided information on our regional fishing areas & opportunities
- Back Country Hunters & Anglers Ohio Chapter which supports and works on conservation and land and water resource management
- Casting for Recovery & Reel Recovery. These agencies use fly fishing as a means to foster recovery and socialization among women and men cancer survivors.
- The May Fly Project which uses fly fishing as a mentoring project among foster children
- The Little Miami Conservancy which leads efforts for restoration and preservation of the Little Miami River, Ohio's first designated National Wild & Scenic River.

Jason Randall's Friday courses were fully subscribed and comments from those who attended were extremely positive. Jason was also very outgoing and engaging with attendees who came by his booth

to chat and/or purchase his book ,which we completely sold out by early afternoon. We should certainly consider having similar programs with future headliners, based on their expertise and interests.

Brian Wise, who led our fly tying program on Friday, and did a tying demonstration on Saturday, made an excellent video that he has posted on his YouTube channel (Fly Fishing the Ozarks). It is also posted on our website and is a very positive promotion for BUFF and the show. If you have not looked at it, please take a few minutes to do so.

We also thank our friends at the Cincinnati Orvis store and Mad River Outfitters who supported us by providing the raffle items we had at the show. We sold all tickets for the Helios Rod outfit and most of the tickets for the Tenkara rod & car carrier items. Finally we wish to thank our 2025 Planning Team for all of their work to make this happen – Tom Agin, Tom Bachey, Scott Biser, Ken Dixon, David Fraley, Debbie Hampton, Sam Hanna, Kathy LaDow, Ken Mandel, Haruko Mizoguchi, Jim Neckers, Kathy Newsom, Lane Stocker, Jim & Cari Vota, Tim Williamson, and Craig Wilson. ## The Invasive Red Swamp Crayfish

There is a new threat to our local environment you may not have heard of. It is the red swamp crayfish, which is also known as the Louisiana crayfish. It's the same crayfish that is farm-raised for crawfish boils.

While their native range is the Southeast United States, it has vastly expanded and now encompasses Ohio and even Michigan. How they got here remains a mystery. Someone may have brought them up north as a food source, or pet shops, which market them as 'miniature lobsters', may have sold them. They're also supplied by biological supply houses for classroom use. Regardless of where they came from, they are in our local ponds.

They're easy to identify due to their large size, bright red color and the bumps on their claws. What is important, is that our local crayfish species cannot compete with this invasive species.



The red swamp crayfish also devastates local populations of small fish, macro invertebrates and vegetation.

Locally, this nasty bugger was discovered four years ago in the Gilmore Ponds Preserve Metropark in Hamilton, OH. The Parks Department captured nearly 40,000 over the past four years just in Gilmore Pond alone!. They grow quickly and a female produces 500-600 eggs per clutch. It has spread to other



local ponds, has been found in Columbus and Toledo, areas bordering Lake Erie, and even into Michigan. Michigan State University is fast tracking a project to define some control measures.

While this photo shows a preferred way of encountering these creatures, we most strongly do not recommend capturing and eating what we find in our local waters; especially not out of Gilmore Pond! Tom Britton and I will keep you updated on this issue when we hear more. In the meantime, you may want to work on tying some large red crayfish patterns for future use.

## Michigan Anglers Base Camp Fly Fishing Trip

This is a reminder for any BUFF members interested in the upcoming 'basecamp' fly fishing trips scheduled this coming spring. The camp is located in central Michigan, and offers access to several incredible rivers. It is a one-week trip (except for week 4), and includes lodging and all meals. Lodging is in cabins at a boy scout camp. Cabins are heated with bathrooms and showers in each cabin. There are 4 weeks scheduled, but week 2 (May  $4^{th} - 10^{th}$ ) is now fully booked and no longer accepting reservations

# Michigan Black Lake Sturgeon Fishing Season


The MI DNR scheduled a fishing season for sturgeon on Black Lake in Cheboygan and Presque Isle counties to run from February  $1^{st} - 5^{th}$ , or until the harvest limit was caught. The harvest limit for this year's season was 6 fish. It was reached in 17 minutes after the start of the season!

There were 797 registered anglers. Fishing with hook and line or spearing was allowed. The fish caught ranged in size from 43.5 – 64 inches and weight from 18 – 78 pounds. Two of the fish had been previously caught and tagged. One was caught and tagged in Black Lake, and the other, the 64" female, was previously captured in the river in 2010 during its spawning run.



## Stocking Schedule for Western North Carolina Rivers –

Folks from Maggie Valley Fly Shop shared the attached table which lists the spring trout stocking schedule for rivers and areas in Western NC.



## **Explaining Fy Tying Thread –**

I found a good video that talks about fly tying thread – differences between denier and aught classification, different thread types, materials and brands. It is by Ryan Ratliff from Mad River Outfitters.

Sizing of threads is measured by Denier or Aught. Denier is a measure of .weight in grams of a specific length of an individual fiber used in weaving fabric; bigger the denier number, the heavier the thread. Also, threads by different manufacturers, which have the same denier numbers will differ in size and strength. These differences reflect the different materials and thread shape used by the manufacturers.

The "aught measure is similar to how one measures of grades wire. The larger the number before the "/0", the smaller the thread diameter. Hence a '6/0' tying thread is heavier than an '8/0' thread. However, there is not a standardization, so an aught measurement thread from one manufacturer can differ from the same measured thread from a different maker. Some makers put both an aught and denier measure on their thread.

### Bead Size, Hook Comparison, & Thread Comparison Tables-

Our club has initiated our 'Beginners Fly Tying Class'. For those who are taking the class, and for others in the club who may be starting to tie, here are some useful tables. They are from J Stockard Fly Fishing. Stockard is a mail order company with a large selection of fly fishing supplies and tying materials. They have developed several useful charts which are available for download from their website. These are listed in a "Fly Tying Resources" page, which is accessed from the very bottom of the home page.

Tables that I find useful are -

- Bead Sizing Chart. This is simple chart that suggests beads that best fit common sized hooks.

- Thread Comparison Chart. Another good tool that helps compare and contrast threads from different manufacturers. There are other hook comparison tables as well. Searching on the internet can help find these. I do caution, that some of the tables I've found are quite old, so the listings may no longer be accurate.

## **North Carolina Spring Trip**

This year Harry Pass will lead the annual spring trip to Bryson City area in NC. Dates are May  $14^{th} - 18^{th}$  There are cabin reservations to accommodate 16 anglers.

Generally, our anglers fish on our own. We will make sure that any new fly anglers or folks new to the area are paired up with someone that has experience with both fly fishing and the area. We highly encourage folks to travel and fish with at least one partner for safety. If anyone prefers to hire a guide, that is possible through area fly shops. The Nantahala and Tuckasegee Rivers are stocked and have delayed harvest regulations over portions of those streams. There is a trophy water section on the Cherokee Reservation that can be accessed, but needs a separate permit (<a href="https://visitcherokeenc.com/play/outdoor-adventure/fish-cherokee/fishing-permit-for-cherckee/">https://visitcherokeenc.com/play/outdoor-adventure/fish-cherokee/fishing-permit-for-cherckee/</a>). Streams in the Great Smoky Mountains National Park, such as



Deep Creek, Forney Creek, Indian Creek, Noland Creek, Socco Creek, and the Oconaluftee River, offer wild trout are nearby and accessible. **No shortage of trout fishing here.**
