ell, it appears that April has stolen March's thunder by coming in like a lion and going out like a lamb. Those of us who attended the spring steelhead trip were met with 6 inches of snow and sub-freezing temperatures. With the cold, the few fish we found were sitting in deep pools, and taking large, articulated streamers. The ingenious Kramer's Nightmare was a particularly productive fly this trip, whoever created that pattern must be a very brilliant and immensely talented fly fisher.

It seems the same cold snap that sent the steelhead deep also made the white bass late for their run on the headwaters of Brookville Reservoir. According to BUFF white bass guru Bob Gustafson, the white bass run typically starts when the redbuds and the dogwoods are in bloom, however this year the males were about a week late, and so far have been going stag. Females are expected to appear in early May, and can generally be distinguished from the males by their larger size, as well as the fact that they usually have a small herd of males chasing them all the way to the net. In some ways, fish and fishermen aren't so different.
