### January Speaker – Cameron Cipponeri – “Atlantic Salmon on the Lower Au Sable”

Cameron's passion for the outdoors started at age six, growing into a 20-year career that has taken him across the country, from Northern Michigan to Colorado, Florida, Arkansas, and Louisiana. Whether guiding fly fishing, or hosting outdoor clinics, his patience, humor, and expertise create unforgettable adventures.

Fully licensed and insured, Cameron holds a Coast Guard Captain's License, allowing him to guide on the Lower AuSable River, home to incredible steelhead, smallmouth bass, and Atlantic salmon fishing. From mid-October to December, you will find him on the river, beneath the last dam, Foote Dam, down to Lake Huron chasing Atlantic Salmon and steelhead. He's either using a two-handed rod or a traditional one-handed rod. The rest of the time he spends on the upper Au Sable and Manistee Rivers.

Off the water, Cameron enjoys time with his wife Kelly and daughter Addison, who often join him on fishing and hunting trips. The team also includes three loyal companions—Roper and Mystic, their English Setters, and Honey, an English Labrador.

Cameron's trout trips are run through Gates Au Sable lodge (<https://gateslodge.com/>, 989-348-8462). Trips for Atlantic Salmon, Steelhead and Bass on the lower Au Sable Rivers are run through his own company, Cameron's Fly Fishing Adventures (<https://www.cameronsflyfishingandadventures.com/>, 248-388-1649).

## Ties, Lies & Pints



# BUFF Fly Tying Classes

## From Lane Stocker

We are going to change things a bit for our winter fly tying classes –

We will start with 4 general topic classes. These will go from mid-January thru early February –

Tuesday, Jan 13<sup>th</sup> **Filling up your fly box** - Has it been a while since you looked at your fly boxes? What do you need to tie for 2026 season? Let's get together, pull out our fly tying supplies and get the new fly fishing year started out right.

Tuesday, Jan 20<sup>th</sup> **Feathers and Tools** - Discussion of feathers used in tying and how they are used. We will go through the club feathers and some of my own stash to learn about this key material for flies. We will also be making and using some fly tying tools. Specifically building dubbing brushes with wire.

Tuesday, Jan 27<sup>th</sup> **Nymphs** - 80% of a trout's diet are nymphs. Let's tie some that will get down to where the fish are hiding.

Tuesday, Feb 3<sup>rd</sup> **Dry Flies** – my favorite fishing; there's nothing like watching a fish rise to and take a fly you tied.

## Beginners Fly Tying –

Classes will be Tuesdays from February 17<sup>th</sup> – March 10<sup>th</sup>. I'm going to change things up a bit with our beginning classes. I'm going to open up the classes to everyone. Beginners will be tying larger sized flies, while those with more experience will have smaller sizes with "extras". Trust me, I'll make it challenging for the experienced tyer. For example, if we are tying an Adams, beginners will tie it in size 10, and those with experience, may be doing an 18 or 20! As usual, the more experienced tiers will be available to coach and help our beginner tiers.

Tuesday, Mar 17<sup>th</sup> **Articulated Flies** – Articulated flies look alive and are extremely effective for picky fish. We will be learning how to use shanks and mono/wire methods.

Tuesday, Mar 24<sup>th</sup> **Flies for White Bass Fishing** – This will get folks ready, and fly boxes stocked up for the white bass trips to Indiana. White with some weight gets you most of the way, but we will be adding some colors and flash to really get them biting.

Tuesday, April 14<sup>th</sup> **Flies for Bluegill & Bass** – Spawning season for bluegill and bass will be just around the corner, and this class will get you ready for them. Bully spiders and various other top water flies will be on the schedule.

I'll be setting up registration. Location will be the Springdale Community Center. Times for each session is 6:00 PM – 8:00 PM (hopefully 8:30 PM). Watch for an eblast announcing this. Of course, these programs are free for BUFF members. I look forward to seeing you at the classes.

## Regional Fly Fishing Shows

There are two upcoming regional fly fishing shows, one in Louisville hosted by Derby City Fly Fishers, and the other in the Cleveland area, hosted by North Coast Fly Fishers. While smaller than the Cincinnati show, they are both excellent shows and have great programs. If you have an open day, consider attending!

The Kentuckiana Fly Fishing Show is on Saturday, January 17<sup>th</sup>, from 9:00 AM – 4:00 PM. Location is the Paroquet Springs Conference Center, 395 Paroquet Springs Dr, Shepherdsville, KY 40165. Presentations include “Fly Fishing on the Cumberland” by Jim Sauerhaber, “Fly Fishing Red River Gorge” by Bill Carman, “Kayak Fishing on KY State Lakes” by Lee McClellan, and “Kentucky Trout Program” by Nathan Hayes. The Northern Ohio Fly Fishing Expo, hosted by North Coast Fly Fishers is on Saturday, March 7<sup>th</sup>, 2026 from 9:00 AM – 3:00 PM. Location is Lakeland Community College, 7700 Clocktower Dr., Kirkland, OH 44094. The program will include tying demonstrations from Lance Kekel and Gary Begley, and seminar presentations by Jeff Liskay (“Roadmap to Success on Steelhead Alley”), Kevin Ramsey (“Secrets of Northern Ohio’s Diverse Fishery”), Gregg Elefterin (“Euro Nymphing”), and Jerry Darkes (“Essential Flies for the Great Lakes Region”).
